

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th  
day of May, A. D. 1893, before  
Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry  
inhabitants of the township of Cooper  
in said county, setting forth that

Labor under great inconvenience for want  
of a public Road running at a point in Town-  
ship road leading to the said duck, where the line  
between lands of the may Estale and Frank Kohls  
intersects the same and running at a point  
at or near house of Fritz Worlock

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out  
the same according to law, and Report at next Term  
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration of the premises, do order and  
appoint Barry Reese, Delaney, Waring & Alf Shields  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their  
appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed  
for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers  
agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same  
agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best  
ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the  
least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the  
same necessary for a PUBLIC ~~private~~ road, together with a plot or draft  
of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements  
through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from per-  
sons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such re-  
leases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof  
to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report  
they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law.  
Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through  
which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to  
the 147th Rule of Court. BY THE COURT.

**NOTE.**—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road. Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed. N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

by the within Order of Court to view and  
lay out the Road therein named respectfully  
report That after having given public notice  
by three written and printed notices put up  
near the location of the said of the time and  
place of meeting to view and lay out the same  
We met at the point of Beginning of said Road,  
on the Seventeenth day of August An 1893.  
And after being duly affirmed in pursuance of  
said Order we viewed and layed out and do  
return for public use the following Road to wit  
Beginning at a Point in Public road running  
from Tylerton to Lindbeck where the Line  
between lands of Way Estate and lands  
of Frank Kral intersects the same. Hence through  
Partly improved and Partly unimproved land  
North four Degrees East one hundred and forty Perches  
Hence through unimproved land North fifty six Degrees  
West fourteen and one half Perches. Hence through the

same North eight degrees west three Perches. Hence  
through the same North fifty and one half degrees East nineteen  
Perches. Hence through the same South eighty nine and  
one half degrees east twenty nine Perches. Hence through  
the same South ~~Eighty~~ Seventy nine degrees East eighteen  
Perches. Hence through the same South eighty seven  
and one half degrees east ten <sup>of</sup> ~~Perches~~ through the same  
South eighty one degrees east two and one half Perches. Hence  
through the same South fifty nine degrees East ten Perches  
Hence through the same South forty eight degrees East  
two and one half Perches. Hence through the same South Sixty
