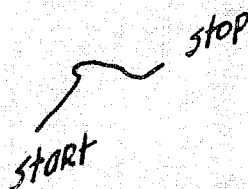

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th day of May, A. D. 1893, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper, in said county, setting forth that

Labor under great inconvenience for want of a public Road Beginning at a point in Township road leading to the Seaduck. where the lines between lands of the May Estate and Frank Kohls intersect the same and ending at a point at or near house of Fritz Worlock

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and Report at next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reese Delaney Waring & Alf Shields who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC ~~or private~~ road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

from Rykerson to Viaduct where the Line  
between lands of Mary Estate and Land  
of Frank Kotal intersects the same. Thence through  
partly improved and partly unimproved land  
North four Degrees East one hundred and forty Perches  
Thence through unimproved land North fifty six Degrees  
West fourteen and one half Perches. Thence through the

same North eight Degrees west three Perches. Thence  
through the same North fifty and one half Degrees East nineteen  
Perches. Thence through the same South eighty nine and  
one half Degrees East twenty nine Perches. Thence through  
the same South ~~Eighty~~ seventy nine Degrees East eighteen  
Perches. Thence through the same South eighty seven  
and one half Degrees East ten Perches. <sup>of thence</sup> Thence through the same
