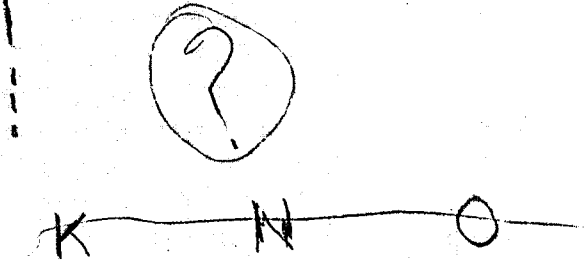

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 15 day of May, A. D. 1893, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in said county, setting forth that

They Sabor under great inconvenience for want of a public Road. Requiring at or near Arnold Bloom House and to intersect the public Road at or near Albert McGarry.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, *Report at next term* whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *G. H. M. Cloudy Henry Kern Jacob Bligh* who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC ~~or PRIVATE~~ road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes; and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Now Nov 24th 1893 Frank Farley by H. A. Chas
his attorney takes exceptions to the confirmation
of report of Viewers to within public road for the
following reasons:

First: The Viewers failed to assess the damage
done to the property of Frank Farley, through
which ^{said public road} ran for a distance of about
thirty two rods and they did not by their
draft indicate the distance through the
lands of Farley taken for said public road.

Second: The Viewers did not note the improvements
on land taken for said public road
and it could not be ascertained from the
report of Viewers whether the land taken
was cleared land or woodland although the
said road as laid by the Viewers passes
through the barn yard and runs through a
field on the farm of said Farley.

Third: The opening order for said road was lifted
and placed in the hands of the Supervisors of
Pike Twp and the road made by the Supervisors
although the report of the Viewers was not confirmed
absolutely by the Court, said road was confirmed

We, the undersigned persons, Appointed
by the within Order of Court, to view, and

Respectfully report.

That having given notice
of the time and place of meeting, according to the act of assembly, and being
all present at the view of the ground
proposed for the said road; and being
all sworn, or Affirmed in pursuance of
the said Order of Court. We have viewed,
and laid out and do return the following
road, viz. Beginning at a Post in land
belonging to Arnold Bloom, and running
Through his land, South Eighty nine degrees
West, Thirteen perches to a Post, a corner of
land of said Bloom, and Albert McGarvey
Thence along the line between said McGarvey
and Frank Farley & John Owens, North Eighty eight
degrees West, Thirty three and two tenths perches
to a Post on line of McGarvey Thence Through
land of John Owens, South fifty three degrees
West, Six and two tenths perches to the Township
road leading ^{to} the mouth of Frogback, near
Albert McGarvey's house.
