We, the undersigned persons appointed by the aforesaid Order of Court, to view and lay out the road therein mentioned, Respectfully report,

That having given notice of the time and place of meeting, according to the Act of Assembly, and being all present at the view of the ground proposed for the said road. And being all sworn, or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order of Court, We have viewed, and laid out, and do return the following road, Viz

Beginning at a Post in the Centre of the Public Road, leading from Clearfield to Curwensville in Lawrence Township, at what is known as "Wright's Corner". Hence along the Public Road and through land of Dorseay Bailey, North Eighteen degrees West, at 6 perches leaving the old road to our right, and at 30 perches into it again, Hence along the said road North twenty seven degrees West, Twenty four perches, North Thirty two and a quarter degrees West, Twenty four perches, North Thirty nine and a half degrees West, and at four perches leaving the old road to our right, into the said Bailey

Sixteen perches to a Post. North Forty six degrees West. Twenty five and four tenths perches to a Post in the Old Road again. South Seventy Seven and a half degrees West. Sixteen and Seven tenths perches to a Post. Hence along the old road, North Eighty eight and three quarter degrees West. Eighteen and four tenths perches to a Post. Hence South Eighty three and a half degrees West, at Crossing the line of Lawrence, into Park Township, and into William Lawhead's field Thirty and four tenths perches to a Post. South Seventy Seven degrees West. Twenty four and six tenths perches to Post. South Sixty three degrees West. Eight and six tenths perches in to the Road again. Hence South Eighty eight and a quarter degrees West. Twenty One and One tenth perches, and cross the line of William Lawhead into land of Emanuel Shinwelder. South Eighty and a half degrees West. Twenty two perches to Post. North Eighty three and a half degrees West. Thirty nine and four tenths perches, to a Post. South Eighty eight West. Twenty and eight tenths perches to a Post. Hence through land of Hugh Mullens Heirs. South Eighty four degrees West. Twenty one and six tenths perches to a Post. West. Eight perches. North Eighty and three quarter degrees West. four and two tenths perches. North Sixty degrees West. Three and two tenths perches. North Seventy eight degrees

West twelve and three tenths perches. North

Eight and three tenths perches to the Township Road leading from Hartsbourn to Curwenville near H. B. Bloom's Barn.

Which said road as above described we are of opinion is necessary for a public Road.


