At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11 day of Aug, A. D. 1893, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Greenwood, in said County, setting forth that

That a public road has lately since been laid out along the Susquehanna River from David Johnston to Geo. Bells in said Township
That the B & R.R. occupies portion of said road & the said road has thereby become dangerous to the Community, That it is the desire of your Petitioners to avoid all Damages & liability on account of the location of said road. That said road has become useless inconvenient and burdensome to the Tax payers of the Twp. Your petitioners therefore pray the Court That the said road may be vacated from a point at an angle in said road on the Bank of the West Branch of the Susquehanna River near the residence of D.H. Johnson to a point at or near W.M. Hadden, in said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{vacate} lay out the same according to law, ^{Make report at next Term}

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ^{Harry Byers C. Howe & N. Hoffer}

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said ^{vacation} road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such ^{vacation} road, they shall proceed to ^{vacate} lay out the same

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, ~~having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the~~

~~least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements~~

~~through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof~~

to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

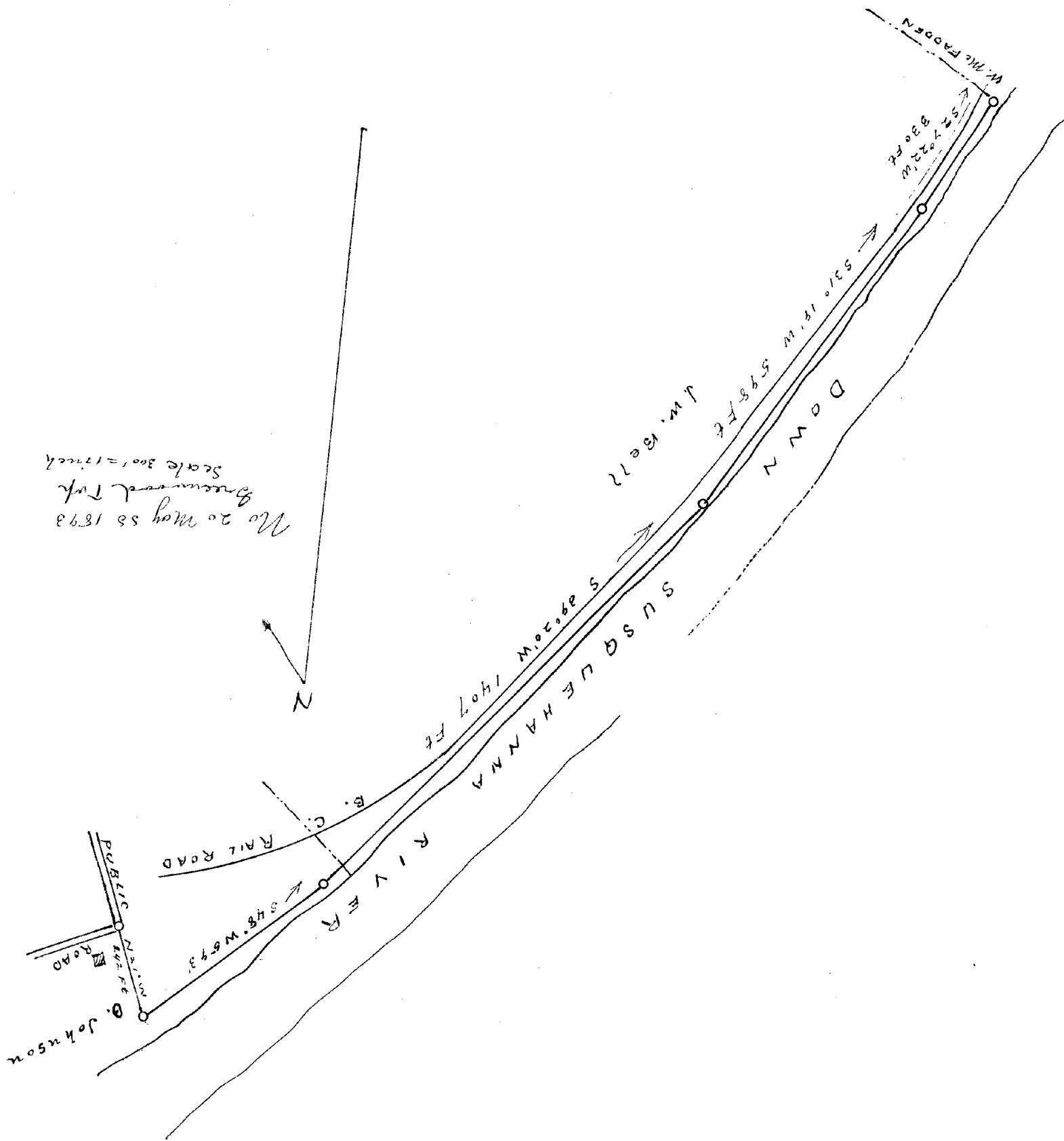

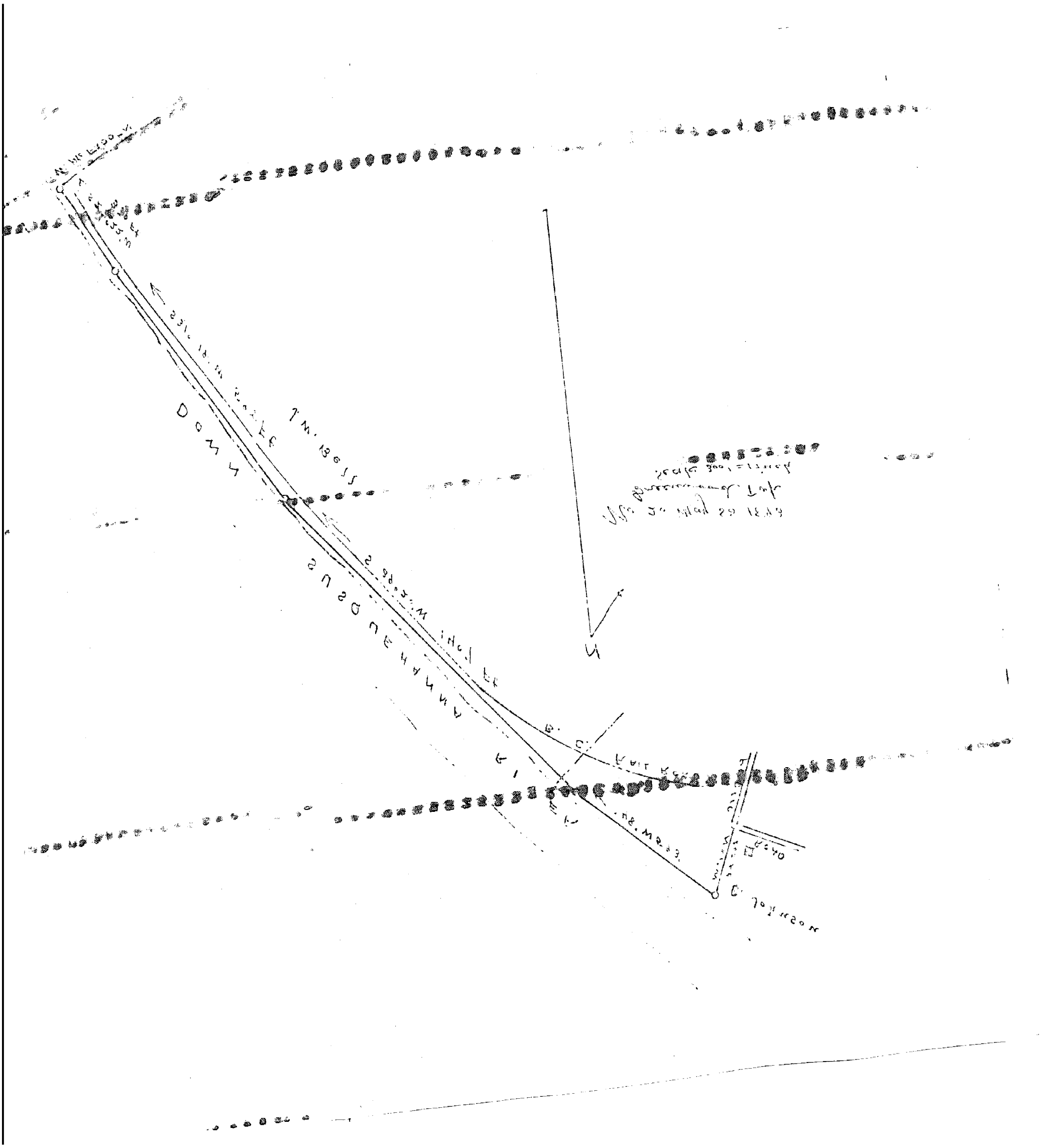
