

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Seventh day of February, A. D. 1894, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in said County, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public ^{to begin in a public Road} road leading from Woodland to Grahamston at the point on said road where the line between land of Dennis Forsey & John Leander intersects said road in Bradford Township and to end in a proposed road leading from "Millstone" ^{Road} to "Dale Church" at a point in said road opposite the house of Dennis Forsey in Bradford Township and layout same according to law & Vacate that part of said road now opened leading from Millstone Road to the Dale Church lying between where the said proposed road intersects said road opposite the residence of D. Forsey & where said road intersects the public road leading from Woodland to Grahamston which last mentioned part of said road will by reason of the laying out of the proposed road ~~create~~ ^{vacate} ^{Supply} and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~and~~ Make report at May 11 1894 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises do order, and appoint Harry Dyer ^{vacate & Supply} Patrick O'Dowdy & D. Forsey who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual ^{vacate} ^{viewers} agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

all being present and having been first sever-
ally sworn or affirmed we have viewed
the ground for their proposed vacation and supply
and have laid out the following road to wit: begin-
ning in public road leading from Woodland to Grahamton
at the point on said road where the line between land of
James Forcey and John Cowder intersects said road. Thence
by said line North four and one half degrees East fifty-
eight perches to road leading from Millstone Road to
Dale's Church at a point in said road opposite house
of James Forcey, which road as laid out aforesaid is

Thence South fifty seven and one fourth degrees East

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
