

To The Hon. the Court within mentioned;

We the Undesignated Viewers appointed by the within order to view and lay out the road herein mentioned respectfully do report that we gave good and lawful notice of said road view by posting notices and with five notices to the County Commissioners as required by Rule of Court and having met on the day appointed in said notices and having been duly sworn we have viewed the ground for the proposed Public Road and have laid out the following road for public use to wit; Beginning at a post on the public road at or near the Skating Rink in Madura ^{stones} along & between lot of - Bannon, D. Hensel and Methodist Church $\Delta 88^{\circ} 45' W$ - 149 feet ^{post}; stones along Alexander Estate $\Delta 80^{\circ} 30' W$ - 328 feet to post; stones along said land $\Delta 79^{\circ} 45' W$ - 477 feet to post; stones along same land $\Delta 70^{\circ} 20' W$ - 765 feet to post; stones along and between lots of R. Lees, T. Hoover, P. Bloom, C. Anderson, Mrs. Reed and others $\Delta 62^{\circ} 30' W$ - 289 feet to post on Public Road at or near the residence of W. F. Dale. A plot or draught of which road is hereto attached showing courses, distances and improvements. Which road is necessary in our opinion as a Public Road. We are of the opinion that no owner of land through which said road passes is entitled to damages for the reason that said road is a benefit to all whom said road passes.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17th day of January, A. D. 1894, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Taylor

, in said County, setting forth that

They lab under great inconvenience for want of a public road to lead from a point on the public road at or near what is known as the Heating rank building in Madera to public road at the residence of W. J. Dale

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Markenpost at next term whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Asa Spencer, William Pickard, Mr. Partridge who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass; or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

To the Honorable, the Court with whom mentioned -
The undersigned brewers, appointed & execs.
the road herein mentioned report, that having
been severely sworn at herein directed and
after the accustomed ten days notice and
Notice having been given County Commission
a regularly called Court and also Notice
to the owners of land through whom road is laid
out, we have cleared the road beginning at a
point on the Public Road at or near the Skating Rink
in Marion to a point on the Public Road at the
residence of W. J. Dale and we do return the said
road as a Public Road for the welfare of all con-

NOTE:—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, as the case may be, taking into account the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
