for the Township to keep up

4th Because the Township is indebted and the building of said  
road at this time will impose too heavy a burden on the  
tax payers of Covington Township

refuse to confirm the report of viewers in above case

To the Hon. Judge of the Court  
of quarter session, of Clearfield Co., Pa.  
We the undersigned viewers ap-  
pointed by the within order of the  
Court to view the road therein men-  
tioned respectfully report.

That having given notice of the place  
and time of meeting, according to the act  
of assembly and rules of Court and being  
present at the view of the ground  
proposed for the said road and being  
sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the  
said order of Court.

We have viewed and laid out, and  
do return, the following road, viz:

Beginning at a point in the centre of  
public road leading from Truchebille  
to Kauffman near the residence of the  
late John Reiter in Coving Twp. Thence  
South Five Degrees and two minutes West Nine  
Hundred feet to post. Thence South one  
Degree and fifty five minutes East Four  
Hundred and fifty feet to post. Thence  
through woodland of Kauffman East South  
Five Degrees and fifty five minutes West  
Two Hundred and one and one half feet  
to a post. Thence South Eighteen and three  
fourth Degrees West One hundred feet to  
post. Thence South Twenty six Degrees and  
fifty minutes West One Hundred and  
Eighty six feet to a post. Thence South  
One half Degree East One Hundred and  
eighty nine feet to a post. Thence South  
Thirty and one half Degrees East Three

Hundred and three and three tenths feet to a  
post. Thence South forty two and one half  
degrees East Four Hundred and ninety two  
feet to a post. Thence South forty six and  
one half degrees East Four Hundred sev-  
enty four and four tenths feet to a post.  
Thence South Thirty six and one half  
degrees East Two Hundred fifty eight and  
one half feet to a post. Thence South twenty  
five and three fourths degrees East Four  
Hundred forty eight feet to a post.

East One Hundred fifty eight feet to a  
post. Thence South thirty four degrees and

Sixty two and one half degrees West Three  
Hundred and sixty six feet to a post. Thence  
South fifty five and one half degrees West  
Two Hundred ninety six and three tenths feet  
to a post. Thence South thirty seven degrees and  
fifty minutes West ninety three feet to an  
Oak tree. Thence South eighteen and one fourth  
degrees West Five Hundred twenty two and  
one half feet to a post. Thence South  
thirty seven degrees and twenty minutes  
West Eight Hundred and ninety seven  
feet to a post. Thence South forty seven  
and three fourths degrees West Four Hun-  
dred feet to a white Oak. Thence South  
thirty three and one half degrees West  
Two Hundred sixty eight and three tenths  
feet to an Oak. Thence Seventy five and  
one half degrees West Seven Hundred  
fifty seven and six tenths feet to a post.  
Thence through improved land of W. Guenot  
and L. Guenot South thirty and one fourth  
degrees West Eighteen Hundred and twenty  
feet to a post. Thence through improved land  
of J. Guenot South fifty five and one half degrees  
West Five Hundred feet to Post & land of F.  
Guenot. Thence along land of said ~~and~~ Guenot  
South six and three fourths degrees West Six  
Hundred seventeen and one half feet to a  
post in the centre of public road leading  
from Tarnant School House to land of W. F.  
Coiller in Karthaus twp. and at the South West  
corner of Frank Guenot's land in Covington twp.  
A plat or draft of which road as laid out

aforsaid is herewith annexed, showing Courses  
Distances and improvements, which said road  
as above described, we are of the opinion is nec-  
essary for public use, for which we endeavour  
to get releases, and we are of the opinion that  
the persons through whose land the said  
road is laid, and whose names are written  
in the assessment page, of the within  
order are entitled to the amount of damage  
therein assessed, and set opposite to their  
respective names.
