At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 25 day of May, A. D. 1894, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell

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~~~~~, in said County, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road from a point on the Clearfield & Jefferson County line at or near the house of J. D. Anthony late of said Township connecting with the public road in Jefferson County to public road leading from Daniel Myers to Hemlock's store at a point on said road at or near Adam Korb's

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report at Sept 20 1894
whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo C Korb Henry C Lenter & J H Koub

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

the Honorable, the Judge within named: We the undersigned pointed by the annexed order do report: That in pursuance thereof, having been severally duly sworn, all the viewers appointed by said order viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion, do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desires of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit:—Beginning at a post in the public road leading from Daul. Foyers to the Hemlock Store, on the line between lands of Hoover, Hughes & Co. and Adam Koort, Thence N. 26° W., on said line 2300 ft. to a post. Thence S. 34° W. Through wood land belonging to E. A. Iorvick, 536 ft. to a Beech in line of Jos. Bouch. Thence partly on lands of said Jos. Bouch, N. $43\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 1060 ft. to a Hemlock on lands of Saiml. Wolf. Thence on same, S. $43\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 500 ft. to a post, thence S. $82\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 547 ft. to a cucumber, thence N. 82° W., 287 ft. to a post, on line of F. H. Frantz, thence on lands of said Frantz, S. 78° W., 823 ft. to a chestnut. Thence S. 56° W., 580 ft. to a pine stump. Thence S. 69° W., 1584 ft. to a Hemlock stump, on lands of Harry Frantz. Thence on lands of same, S. 87° W., 836 ft. to a Hem. stump. Thence North $65\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West, 535 ft. to a post. Thence N. 55° W., 410 ft. to a Hem. stump, thence N. $36\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 720 ft. to a post, in line of Christian Most. Thence on the line between said Frantz and Most, 1000 ft. to a post, thence N. 23° E., 1350 ft. to a pine stub on lands of J. W. Anthony Est. Thence on lands of said Anthony Est., N. 17° W., 420 ft. to a post, thence N. 10° E., 475 ft. to a Hem. stump, thence N. 35° W., 750 ft. to a Hemlock, thence N. 40° W., 1200 ft. to a post. Thence N. $5\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 550 ft. to a post, thence N. $33\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 750 ft. to a post. Thence N. $12\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 440 ft. to a chest. stump, thence N. 28° W., 330 ft. to a chest. stump. Thence N. 36° W., 580 ft. to a post, thence N. $26\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 350 ft. to a post, thence N. 56° W., 325 ft. to a pine stump, on lands of S. G. Kuntz, thence on lands of same, N. $87\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 546 ft. to a post in public road this day laid out by viewers in Jefferson County. We further report that there are no damages accruing to any of the owners of the land through which said road passes, by reason of the opening of the same, that before the said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up in the vicinity, and notice was given to all the owners of the lands on which said road is located, and also to the County Commissioners, and we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which the same passes.
