At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of September, A. D. 1895, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Penn \_\_\_\_\_, in said County, setting forth that

they labor under great inconveniences for want of a public road or highway to lead from a point on a public road leading from Grampian to Halls Mill, Penn Township Clearfield County - Starting near lands belonging to Catholic Congregation in Penn Township and running to ~~the~~ near Hepbwinia, intersecting a road leading from Bells Landing to Grampian - We also pray the Court to take measure to vacate a public road leading from Cross Roads near Catholic Church to WW Noris as said is on high ground and is always badly drifted in winter and most of the time in winter is completely obstructed by drifts -

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Thomas Moore John Peritz <sup>aka</sup> John Coons who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court. To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon, President,

We the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the foregoing Order of Court to view the road therein described, and also to vacate a portion of a Public road or highway beginning at the cross roads near the Catholic Church to W. W. Norris' in Penn Township, do Report that after first having given due notice of more than five days by partly written and printed advertisements put up according to Law of the time and place of meeting, we all met and first having been duly Affirmed, we have viewed the ground upon which said road is proposed to be located and that in our opinion there is not sufficient demand for the travelling public to justify the opening of said road, which a considerable portion thereof would be over low swampy ground, and be expensive to make and would also go through improved land so as to materially damage the same. Therefore taking all the circumstances surrounding the case in consideration we are of the opinion that the necessity does not exist to locate and build the road, and we also Report no occasion to vacate any part of the Public Road above described, all of which we respectfully submit.

effect.

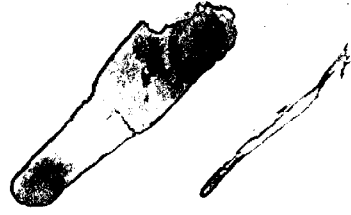
