At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 18th day of ~~December~~ ^{November}, A. D. 1895, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of ~~Goshen~~ ^{Goshen}, in said County, setting forth that

They labor in great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin at a point in Goshen Twp on Rwp. road leading from Clearfield to Kaituma at a point where said road is refused by Jno M Nelson's private road leading from his house east, and its end at a point on said Clearfield and Kaituma road at the stone bridge across said road on the M. A. Nelson farm and that the public road runs in an oblique line from the said point and then that portion of public road between said points of proposed new road hence-
lofore laid out as part of said Clearfield & Kaituma Road not opened, & vacated & supply

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~are upon to next term~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John Stephenson Richard Iron Henry Mead who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court. RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

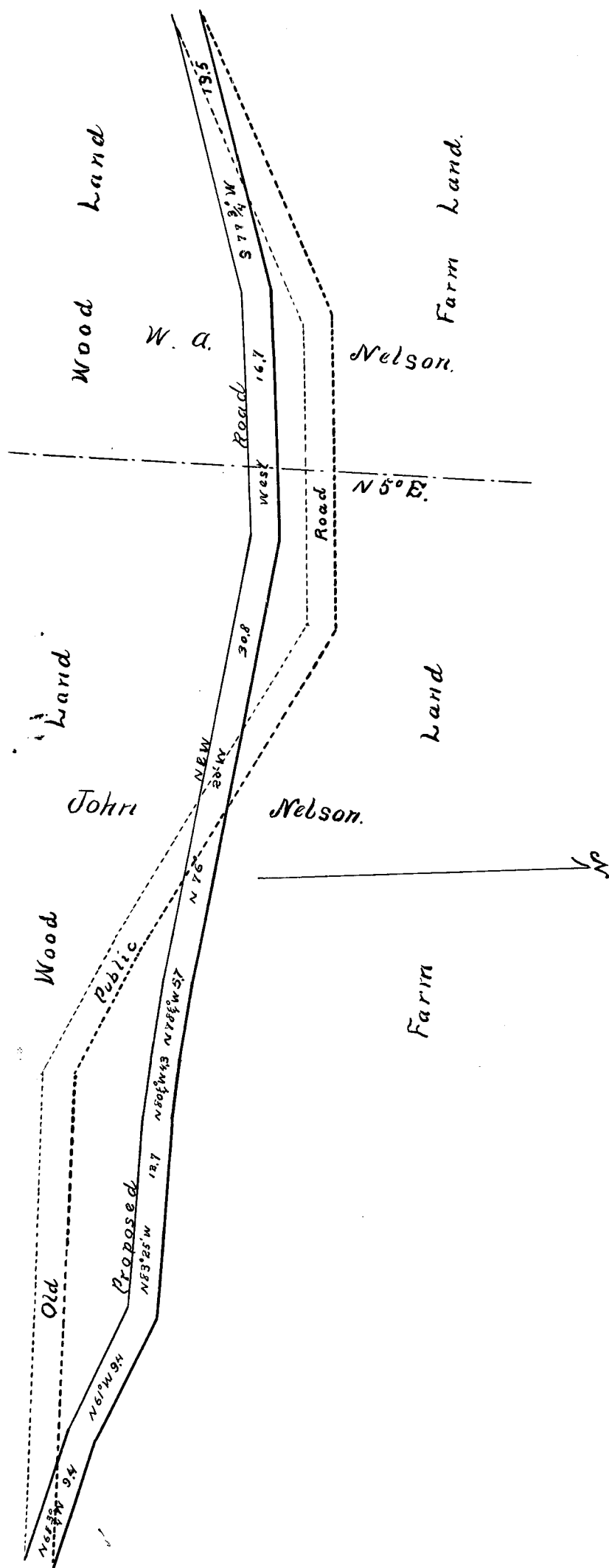

sylvania. We the undersigned viewers
appointed by the within order of Court
to view and lay out the road therein
mentioned, Respectfully report that
we gave good and lawful notice of
said road view by posting notices where
road was to be laid out at least ten
days before said road view and gave
five or more days written notice to the
Commissioners of Clearfield County and
having met at time and place men-
tioned in said notices, all being pres-
ent at view and having been severally
sworn or affirmed as within directed
we have viewed the proposed ground
for to vacate and supply said road,
and do return for public use the
following road, to wit: Beginning at
a point in Goshen Township on John W.
Helons Property where his private road
intersects the public road leading from
Clearfield to Karkaus. Thence through the
land of said John W. Helon North Sixty
Eight and three fourths Degrees West ($N 68\frac{3}{4}^{\circ} W$) Nine
and four tenths Perches thence North Sixty
one Degrees West ($N 61^{\circ} W$) Nine and four tenths
Perches thence North Eighty three Degrees and
twenty five minutes ($N 83^{\circ} 25' W$) West Twelve
and seven tenths Perches ^{to a ~~side~~ ^{ridge} ~~ridge~~} thence Eighty
and one fourth Degrees West four and
three tenths Perches to a Chestnut. Thence

North Seventy Eight and one fourth Degrees
West Five and Seven tenths Perches, Thence
North Seventy six Degrees and Twenty min-
utes West Thirty and Eighth tenth Perches
Thence also through land of W. A. Nelson
West Sixteen and Seven tenths Perches
Thence still through land of W. A. Nelson
South Twenty Seven and Three fourths
Degrees West Nineteen and One half Perches
to the Centre of a stone Bridge on the

draft of which road as a fore laid out is
hereunto annexed, showing courses, distances
and improvements. Which road is necessary
in our opinion for a public road. We
have obtained releases from all damages
from all property owners along said road.

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

In the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pa.

To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions
of the County of Clearfield:

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the township
of Goshen, in the County of Clearfield, Pa. respectfully represents:-
That they labor under great inconvenience, for the want of a public
road to begin at a point in Goshen Township, said county, on the town-
ship road leading from Clearfield to Karthaus, where said township
road is intersected by John W. Nelson's private road, leading from his
house east, and to end at a point on said Clearfield and Karthaus road
at the stone bridge across said road on the V.A. Nelson farm in said
township. The petitioners therefore pray the court to appoint three
persons, qualified according to law, to view the ground, proposed for
such road, and, if they see occasion to lay out the same, to inquire of
and vacate the the public road now in use between the said two point
of the said proposed new road, and to vacate, also, that portion of the
public road, between the said points of said proposed new road, hereto-
fore laid out as a part of the said Clearfield and Karthaus road, and
not opened, which said mentioned roads or parts of roads last mention-
ed will, by reason of the laying out of the proposed road, become use-
less; and make report of their proceedings to the next court.
