



The petition of the undersigned citizens of said County
respectively represents, that they labor under inconvenience, for
in Lawrence township in said county,

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 27th day of September, A. D. 1895, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of _____

_____, in said County, setting forth that that they labor under inconvenience for the want of a public road in Lawrence Township in said County leading from the South Eastern end of Ogden Avenue on the line of Betts addition to the Borough of Clearfield to a point on the public road leading from Clearfield towards Clearfield Creek on the farm belonging to the heirs of Amelia McNally deceased, where Ogden Avenue continued in the present course would intersect said road being a distance of about one fifth of a mile more or less said road would make an easier and more regular grade for a road much needed and used

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, W. J. Hoffer, and John Brown who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
