At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the
county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clear-
field, in and for said county, on the 4
day of May, A. D. 1896, before
Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry
inhabitants of the township of Saunder
in said County, setting forth that

the same according to law, Report to Sept Term 1896

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and
appoint Amos Klimes Osborne Jes Chen

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their
appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed
for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers
agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same
agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best
ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the
least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the
same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft
of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements
through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from per-
sons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such re-
leases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report
they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law,
Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through
which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to
the 147th Rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

ASSESTMENT OF DAMAGES.

The following persons, having refused to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and the opening of the said road in the annexed return described, we, the undersigned viewers, under oath in pursuance of our duty, under the Act of Assembly, do assess their damages and make report thereof, as follows :

To the Honorable, the Judge within named: We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order do report; That in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn according to law, all the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion, do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable, agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do we turn for public use the following described road, to wit:—Beginning at a post in the public road, near where Coal Run crosses the same at Amos Kline's in Sandy Twp., Clearfield Co., thence S. 35° E. along lands of H. J. Kline fourteen hundred and eleven (1411) feet to a post on lands of E. DuBois. Thence S. 84° E. eight hundred and nine (809) feet to a post. Thence S. 20° E. five hundred and twenty seven (527) feet to a post in Union Township, in said County. Thence S. 65° 45' E. Two thousand one hundred and fifty seven (2157) feet to a post on lands of Able DuBois. Thence S. 77° E. Two thousand six hundred and forty six (2646) feet to a post. Thence S. 86° E. one thousand two hundred and seventy six (1276) to a Hemlock, on lands of Chas. Blanchard. Thence S. 2° 30' E. two thousand one hundred and ten (2110) feet to a post in the public road leading from Sabula to Rockton, at George Bowersox's lane, in said Twp. of Union. We further report that there are no damages accruing to any of the owners of the lands through which said road passes, by reason of the opening of the same, except George Bowersox, and therefore, having taken into consideration the advantages to be derived to the said George Bowersox, from the roads passing through his land, we have assessed the damages sustained by the said George Bowersox, at Twenty (\$20.00) dollars. That before said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity ten days before said meeting. That notice was given to the owners of the land and to the County Commissioners ten days before said meeting, and we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which the same passes. 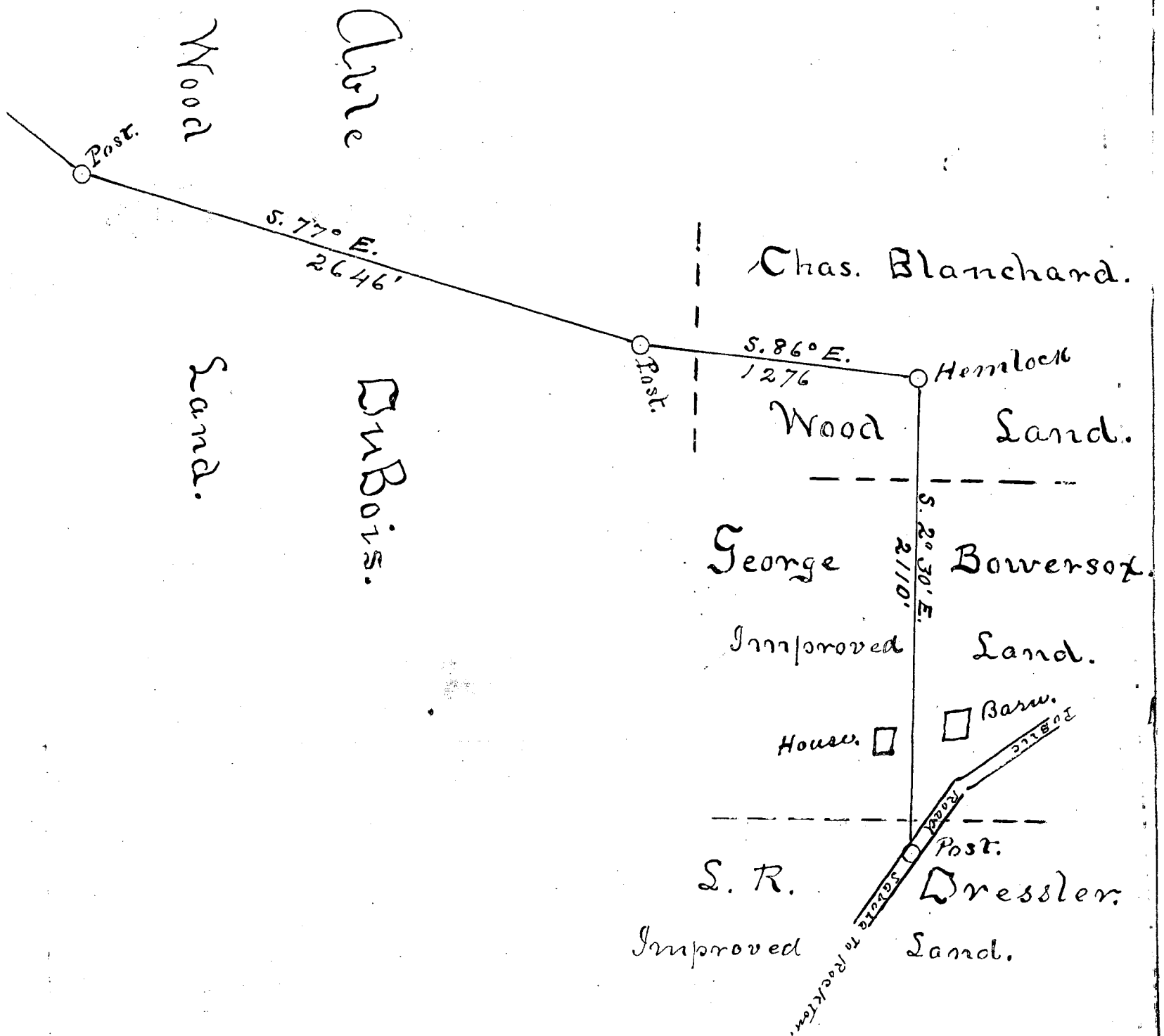

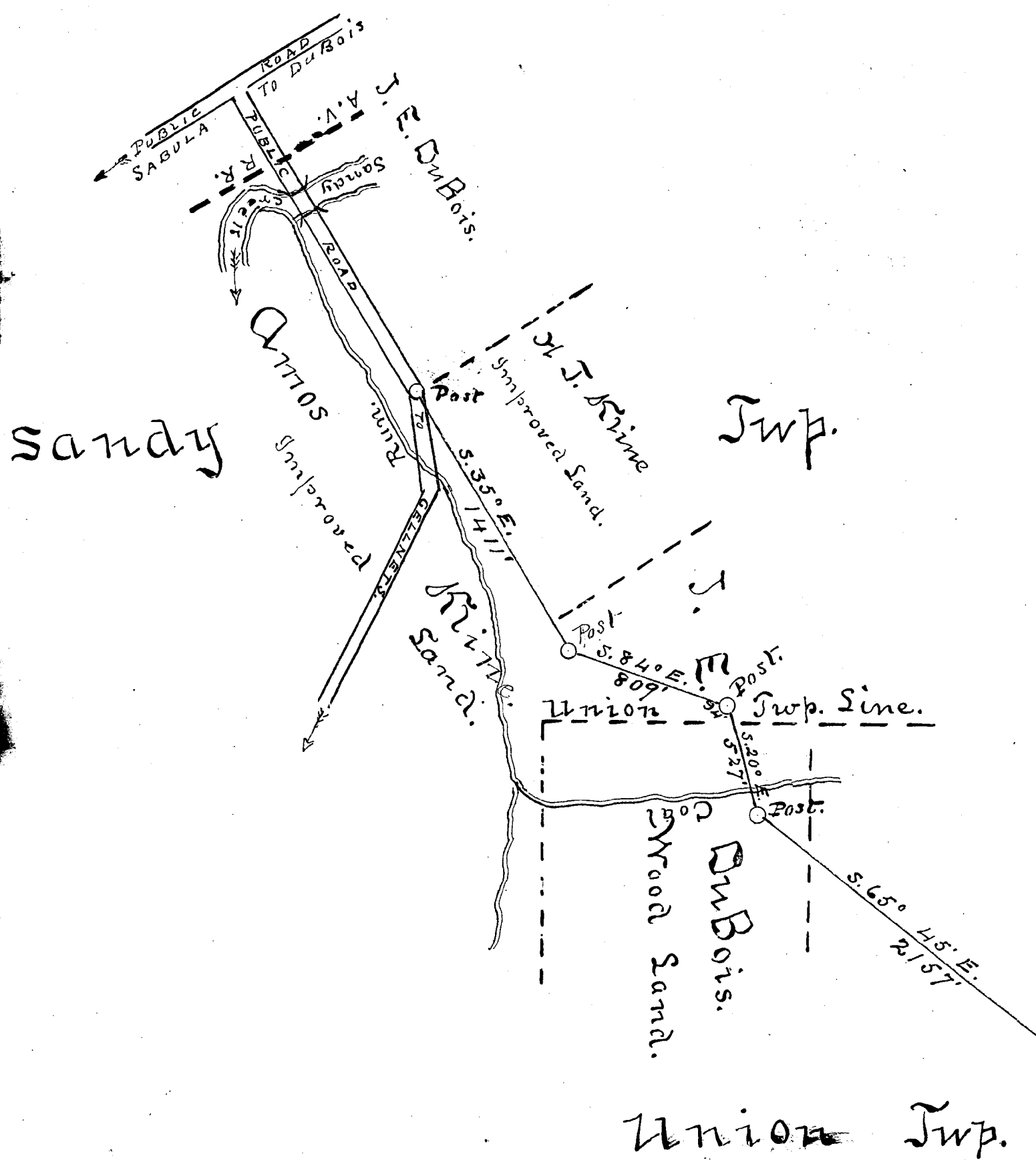

ecuted in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also-Viewers will carefully note the number of days em-
ployed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the
original viewers, except so far as the location may be
changed by the reviewers.
N. B - If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to
damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well
as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that
effect.

To the Honorable, Cyrus Gordon, Judge of
the Court of Quarter Sessions.

The petition of the undersigned, respectfully
represent: That a road beginning at a point
where Cold Run crosses the Public road
at Amos Kliver's in Sandy Township, in
Clarfield County, thence running by various
courses and distances to a public road
at a point where the lane coming out
from George Bowers intersects said
public road ^{in Union Township this County}, was laid out by order of this
Court, and confirmed at the Sessions,
A.D. 1879 but never opened.

The petitioners therefore pray the Court to
inquire of and change the location of said
laid out road so as to evade the swamp
and hill, thus giving a better grade and a
location cheaper for construction, but
beginning and ending at the same points
as those of the road already laid out, and
for that purpose to appoint three
persons, qualified according to law, to review
said road, and make report at the next
term of this Court, and they will con. pray.
