At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 4 day of May, A. D. 1896, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of

....., in said County, setting forth that

a ~~public~~ road has been laid out from Jno J. Quigley's farm to Bloom Trap which road upon petitioners' concurrence is now used as a convenient burden on to the inhabitants of said Trap.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{and vacate} ~~and lay out~~ the same according to law, ^{and report to Sept Session 1896} whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Thos W Moon, A. Cleaver, R. Thompson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is ^{no} ~~occasion~~ ^{vacate} ~~to lay out~~ the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, ~~as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property,~~ and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes; and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

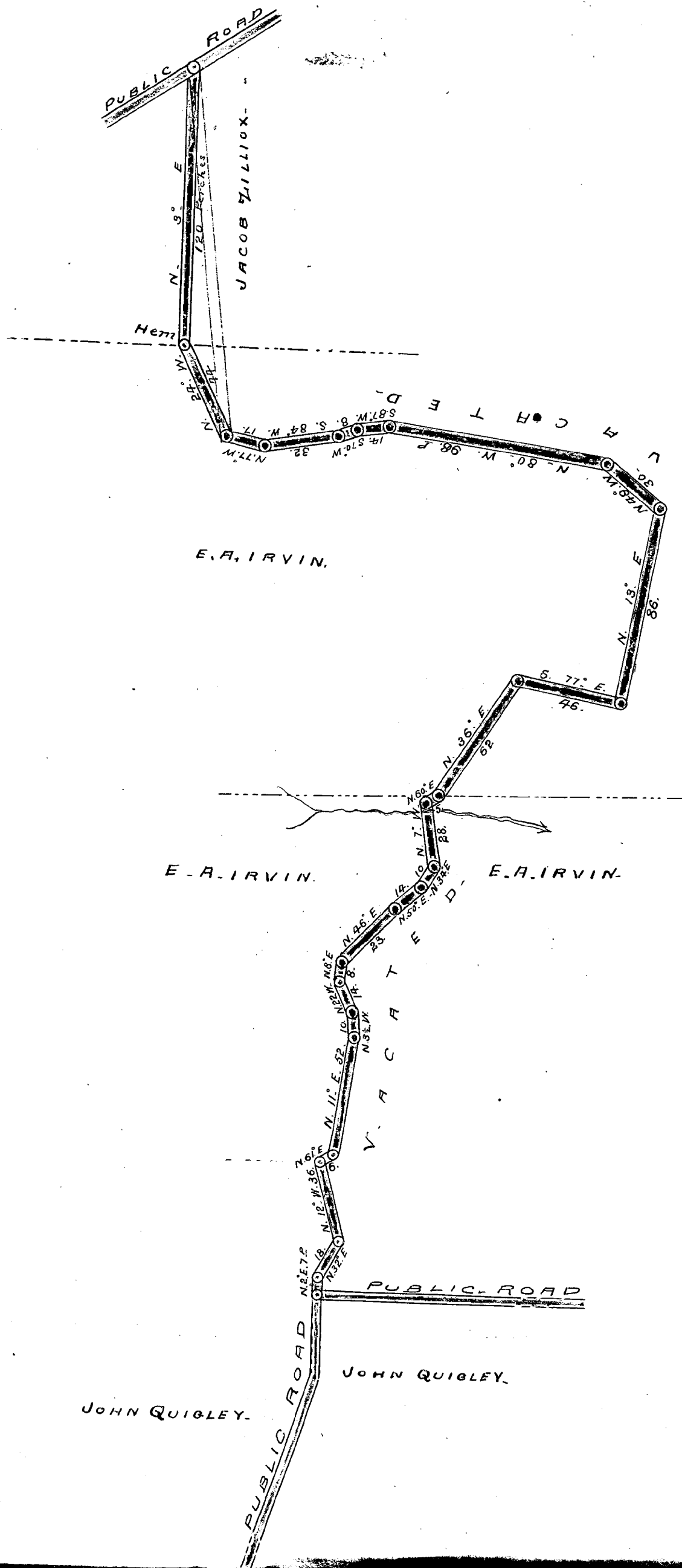

to law. We all met: and being duly affirmed
we have viewed and examined said prem-
ises. whereon said Road had been located. and
we are of the opinion that the following described
portion of the same is useless for public travel
and should be vacated. as follows. Beginning

ecuted in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days em-
ployed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the
original viewers, except so far as the location may be
changed by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to
damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well
as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that
effect.
