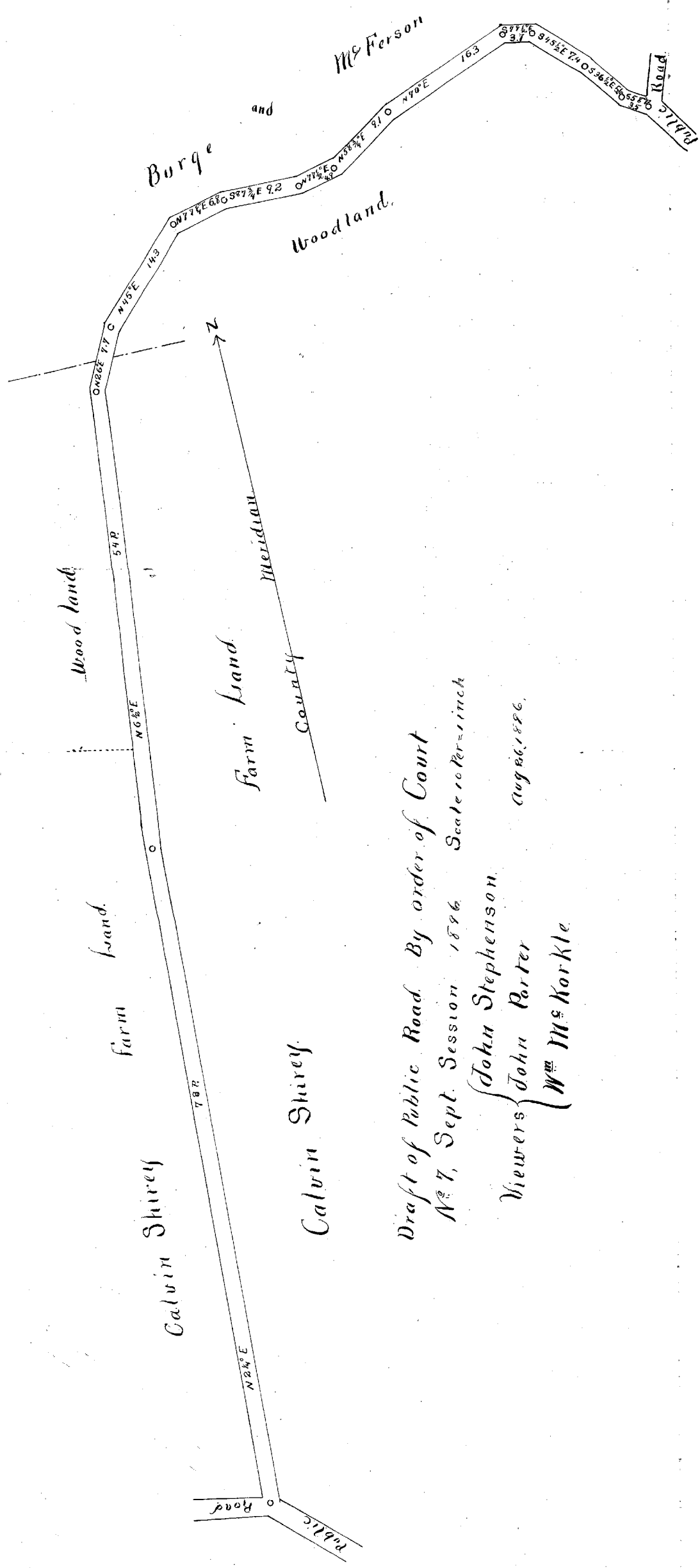

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 18th day of May, A. D. 1896, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in said County, setting forth that

That a public road has long since been laid out Beging at or near the Base on the Calvin Sherry place, on the road leading from Woodland to Shawsville in said Twp and ending at the mouth of Mill Stone Run in said Twp. Has become useless inconvenient & Burdensome

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ^{Vacation} ~~and Report to next Term~~
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ^{Vacation} ~~John Stephens~~ ^{Vacation} ~~John Porter~~ ^{Vacation} ~~Wm M Corkle~~
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{Vacation}, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such ~~road~~ ^{Vacation}, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{Vacation} the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, ~~having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make~~ report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, ~~Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 14th Rule of Court.~~ BY THE COURT.

good and lawful notice of said road
view, with notice to County Commissioners
of County aforesaid and met agree-
able thereto, and having been severally
sworn or affirmed, we have viewed and
do return the following road to be

Barn on the road leading from Woodland

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in the county aforesaid, respectfully represents:-

That a public road has long since been laid out beginning at or near the barn on the Calvin Shirey place, on the road from Woodland to Shawsville, in Bradford township, said county, and ending at the mouth of the Millstone Run in said township of Bradford, said county has become useless, inconvenient, and burdensome.
