At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 18 day of May, A. D. 1896 before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Newland, in said County, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience  
for want of a public road leading  
from Sabella to Brocwayville at  
or near the residence of John Ulrich  
in Sandy Tops ~~Old~~ <sup>By</sup> and to one  
in public road leading from  
Marrow's Creek at Grangefall and  
along <sup>to</sup> Dioxon's Barn in said  
Twp.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, *Report to Sept 1896*  
whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *W. M. Murray and G. Steward and M. C. Osborne*  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court. 

To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon,

Judge of Court of Quarter Sessions,

We, the undersigned, appointed by the annexed Order, do report; That after having been severally Sworn and affirmed, all the Viewers appointed by said Order viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and do agree that the same is necessary for a public road and we do return for public use the following described road, to wit;

Beginning at a point in the Public Road leading from Sabula to Brockwayville, near the residence of John Uhren,

Thence North, eighty nine minutes West, 19.64 chains;

Thence, South, forty three degrees West, 3.42 chains;

Thence, South, twenty eight degrees West, 2.23 chains;

Thence, South, twenty degrees twenty minutes West, 5.15 chains

Thence South Three degrees twenty minutes East, 2.44 chains;

Thence, South, twenty six degrees twenty one minutes East, 2.15 chs,

Thence, South, Fifty seven degrees thirty one minutes East 2.48 chs.

Thence, South, twenty six degrees twenty one minutes East, 2.11 chs.

Thence, South, ten minutes West, 6.965 chains;

Thence, South, three degrees twenty four minutes West, 2.95, chais,

Thence, South, 29 degrees forty four minutes West, 6.19 chains;

The undersigned further report, that they endeavored to procure from all the owners of the land over which said road passes, releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, and that they procured such releases from Charles Dixon, jr., S.W. Parker, Alonzo Dixon, A.R. Hildabrand, Charles Dixon, sr., J.E. Du Bois, and failed to procure a release from Joseph Uhren, and therefore having taken into consideration the advantages to be derived to the said Joseph Uhren from the road passing through his land that he sustains no damage by the opening of said road.

Report of Viewers, (2)

And we further report, that before the said view, public notice of the time and place of meeting of the Viewers was given to all parties in interest according to law, and we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, noting briefly the improvements through which the same passes.

The releases obtained we return on the Order of Court attached hereto, and we also return a copy of said Notice.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.  
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.  
Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.  
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
