



Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 9 day of September, A. D. 1890, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence and Pike Township, in said county, setting forth that

"a road was lately laid out extending from a point in Public road at or near the residence of George Hall, in Lawrence Township to point on Public road in Pike Township leading from Marshallton to the Borough of Curwensville. That the portion of said road extending across the farm of William Lawhead is steep and not properly laid out, ~~and~~ will be expensive to repair. That said road can be improved by changing that portion of said location."

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~and report to the next Quarter Session~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~Samuel~~ ^{James} ~~Biggs~~ ^{Supper} ~~George~~ ^{John} ~~Poxler~~ ^{Supper} who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a ~~PUBLIC~~ ^{or PRIVATE} road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court. To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Penna; we the undersigned viewers, appointed by the within order of court, to view, vacate and supply the road therein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said roadview and met agreeable thereto on the nineteenth day of October A D 1896 and having been severally sworn or affirmed we have viewed and ~~assayed~~ the following road to wit beginning at the present Twp road leading from George Halls to road leading from Hartshorne to Curwensville borough where said first mentioned road is crossed by the line of the farm of Wm Lawhead thence through land (improved) of said William Lawhead North ~~and one half~~ eighty two degrees East ninety feet, East two hundred and fifty feet, North seventy five degrees East three hundred and fifty four feet thence north seventy seven degrees East three hundred and eight feet thence north eighty four degrees East three hundred and fifty one feet thence north eighty eight and one half degrees east one hundred feet to point in said road at Eastern line of land of William Lawhead which road described has been laid out (on 3 Sept 1892) but never opened and in our opinion is useless inconvenient and burdensome and should therefore be vacated to supply which road we have viewed and do return for public use the road in use at present between points aforesaid to wit: beginning at Western line of Wm Lawhead's farm, thence North eighty nine and one half degrees east two hundred and sixty six feet thence north seventy nine and one half degrees East two hundred and twenty one feet thence North seventy five and one half degrees East two hundred and thirty eight feet thence North eighty and one half degrees East seven hundred and thirty feet to Eastern line of Wm Lawhead, which road is necessary in our opinion for a public road. We recommend that the road in use through said farm of Wm Lawhead and which we have viewed be widened to the 33 feet required by law by adding the necessary distance to the lower side measured from fence at upper side of road. A plat or draft of which roads aforesaid is herewith annexed showing courses distances and improvements. Witness our hands this 24th day of October A D 1896

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
