Clearfield County, s.S:-

At a court of quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Clearfield, in and for the county of Clearfield, on the 29th day of May, A.D. 1896, before the judge of the said court, upon petition of the inhabitants of the townships of Goshen and of Girard in the county of Clearfield, Pa., setting forth that "That a bridge is much wanted over Surveyor run, at its mouth, at the place where the public highway from Clearfield to Karthaus crosses said run, on the line between the said townships aforesaid, the bridge over the said run now being dilapidated and in an unsafe condition, and that a new bridge must be erected at said place to accommodate the traveling public; and that the expense of erecting said bridge would be burdensome upon the inhabitants of the said townships and more than they reasonably should bear", the court on due consideration appoints

John M. Stephenson and Readth M. Rheem viewers who
after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge and if they agree that there is occasion for such bridge, and that the erecting of said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly at the next sessions of the court of Quarter Sessions.

The petitions of the undersigned, inhabitants



of Court, review bridge over Turkey Run, where

River, where said bridge spans, being upon
a highway regularly laid out for public use, the
undersigned River, do report, That we gave
good and sufficient notice of said review, notice to County
Commissioners of said County, and such agreeable there to
