At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 29 day of May, A. D. 1896, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Beecharia, in said County, settling forth that

The proposed leading from the lower end (North) of Blaine City in said Township at a point about near the Slaughter Shop of near the Iroonia Borough line in its present location by reason of its excessive grade and deviation from the proper route is in Consequence would interfere with the public travel by a change in its location between the two points mentioned, viz. That point of said road beginning at a point on said road at the residence on the John Lightner farm and ending at a point on said road at the intersection with the Mahoile road

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~and lay out~~ ^{Vacate & Supply} the same according to law, ~~and report to Sept Decem 1896~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Wade Hager, James McLean, Philip Doty who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{Vacate & Supply} the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

The undersigned viewers, appointed by the
Court to view the premises, and report
upon the advisability of vacating and
supplying the road set forth in the
petition, would respectfully report -

That having given due legal
notice, and notice to County Commis-
sioners, of the time and place of meeting,
they meet upon the line of said road
on the 27th day of August A.D. 1896 at
10 o'clock A.M., and having all been
first severally sworn, they proceed to
attempt to obtain releases of damages
from the persons affected by the action
of the viewers as herein set forth.

which was done after having carefully
viewed said road proposed to be
vacated and all the ways by which
it can be supplied, and they report
in favor of the vacation of the road
set forth in the petition, the pre-
cise courses and distances thereof being
hereinafter set forth, that they find
that the said road is no longer nec-
essary for public use; the viewers.

however believe that, a private road should be maintained in the present route for the benefit of John Lightner.

The viewers further report in supplying the said vacated road by a road running as set forth in this report from a point at or near the residence of John Tryer on Public Road leading from Blair City to Ivona to a point on said road, a distance of 450 ft. from Slaughter Shop of Mrs Laugh embank in Ivona Borough and they have therefore laid out said road for public use, believing the same to be necessary. A draft is hereto attached showing the courses and distances, as well as the lands through which the said vacated and proposed new road pass, said draft being hereto attached and made part hereof.

The viewers further report that they find no land owner entitled to receive damages except as herein set forth.

The part of the road vacated by this report
is as follows,

Beginning at a point near John Fryers
hence north $4^{\circ} 00'$ west 527 feet. Hence
north 1 degree west 997 feet. Hence north
3 degrees east 350 feet. Hence north
74 degrees and 30 minutes east 557 feet
to intersection of road leading from
Utahville to Ivonav Borough.

The proposed new road laid out
for public use is as follows.

Beginning at a point at or near the
residence of John Fryer. Hence
north 28 degrees and 30 minutes west 382 feet
to a post. Hence north 53 degrees west
390 feet to post. Hence north 58 degrees
west 453 feet to a post. Hence north
29 degrees west 354 feet to post. Hence
north 19 degrees and 30 minutes west
1605 feet to small hemlock on line of
Ivonav Borough. Hence north 56 degrees
and 30 minutes west 464 feet to post at intersec-
of road leading from Utahville to
Ivonav Borough.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

That the Township or Public Road leading from the lower end (North) of Blain City in said Township, at a point at or near the Coke Ovens, to a point on said road at or near the slaughter shop of ~~near the~~ Irvona Borough line, in its present location, by reason of its excessive grade and deviations from the proper route, is inconvenient, and would better accomodate the public travel by a change in its location between the two points mentioned.
