Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 10th day of Sept, A. D. 1896, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Jordan

_____, in said county, setting forth that a road was laid out by said Court commencing at a point near Johnston School House on a public road leading from Aaronsville to Glen Hope and extending to a public road leading from Berwinstale to Irona. That said road from its present location has become inconvenient and burdensome and does not accommodate the travelling public.

They therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint viewers to vacate and supply said road by laying out a road to commence at a point on public road leading from Aaronsville to Glen Hope and to extend to a point on a public road leading from Berwinstale to Irona near what is called Hunters Hill and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, & report the same to December Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John Lightner, I. W. Bailey and Philip Dotto who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
