We, the Undersigned Viewers appointed
by the Within order of Court to view and
lay out the road therein mentioned
respectfully report that After having given
due public Notice by three written
and printed Notices put up near the
location of said road of the time and
place of meeting to view and lay out the
same we met at the Lancing School
house on Thursday the fourth day of November
A.D. One thousand Eight hundred and
Ninety Seven and after having been duly
affirmed in pursuance of the Within
order we proceeded to view and lay out
and do return for public use the
following road to wit:

Beginning at a point in public road
running from Kyler town to Kyler Mills
and five hundred feet South East of the
Lancing School house. Thence South Seventy
Eight degrees East four hundred and
Ninety Seven feet. Thence North Seventy six
degrees East four hundred and eight
feet. Thence South Eighty degrees East
one hundred and Thirty three feet

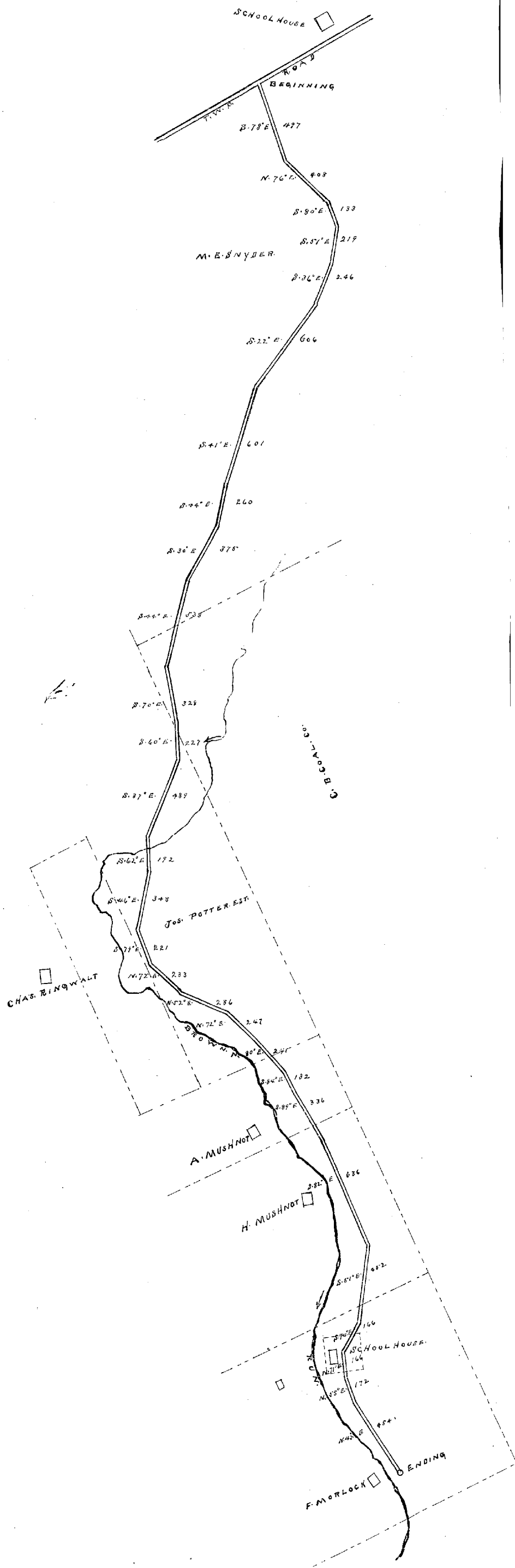

two hundred and nineteen feet. Thence South
thirty-six degrees East two hundred and
forty six feet. Thence South twenty two degrees

thirty degrees East, three hundred and seventy

they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public Road beginning at a point in public road running from Kyles town to Kyles Mills on lands of Martha E Snyder & ending at a point near house of Fritz March in said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, reference to next Regular Session whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reece AC Dale and Nicholas who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC ~~or PRIVATE~~ road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
