Dickison, in Bigler Township, has become useless, inconvenient and burthensome,

Your petitioners would therefore pray the Court to appoint proper persons to view the same and to report to the Court, that the same may be vacated, and they will ever pray &c


At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26 day of February, A. D. 1897, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Buccania, in said county, setting forth that

That a road has long since been laid out and opened from Hagenta: Cross Roads in Buccania Twp. to Ramsey Maderal and that that portion of old said road lying partly in three townships above mentioned beginning at a point on said road in Buccania Twp. at its intersection with the new road leading from Buccania P.O. to Smoke Run and ending at a point on said road at site of the burned barn of W R Dickinson in Biggs Twp. has become useless & burdensome.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~report to May Term 1897~~ ^{vacate} whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~and direct the~~ ^{to} ~~and direct the~~ ^{to} B M Brath & Al McElroy who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the ~~actual~~ ^{viewers} agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
