At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28 day of Oct, A. D. 1897, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Greencastle,

, in said county, setting forth that a certain public road leading from the road near A. H. Newcomer's to Penn Sypline to vacate as there is a public road on the ridge on both sides of said road. The said road running along Bucy Run and has been badly damaged by driving logs on said Run, and as they are building a Rail Road along said Run, which destroy a great part of said road and it will cause a great loss. For the Tax payers to maintain the same as a public road, as there are very few travel on said road and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ the same according to law, Make Report to next Session whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~Surveyors~~ John J. Hactt, Isaac Wolf who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said ~~road~~, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, ~~having respect to the best~~ ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
