day of September, 1897, before the judge of the said court upon the peti-
tion of divers inhabitants of the township Greenwood in the said county
of Clearfield setting forth that an iron bridge is much needed over
Curry Run in Greenwood township, Clearfield County at a point where the
public road leading from Curwensville to Mahaffey, via Bell's Landing
crosses Curry run aforesaid, ~~that~~; that the bridge needed over said
run would be too expensive for the inhabitants of said township to build
the court upon due consideration appoint *Thomas Shunk, P.B.*
Zutmeyer & John L. Stewey viewers of said bridge, who after
being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impar-
tially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed
for said bridge and if they agree that there is occasion for such bridge
and that the erection of said bridge would require more expense than it
would be reasonable the said township should bear, they are to make re-
port accordingly, and a map or plot to be made, which shall accompany
said report; the report aforesaid to be made at the next court of Quar-
ter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.
