At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the

30 day of Sept., A. D.

1897, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Greenwood in said

County, setting forth that an Iron Bridge

is much needed over Cuny Run in Greenwood in Clearfield County at a place where the Public Road leading from Cinnemussey to Mahaffey via Bells Landing crosses Cuny Run aforesaid, That the Bridge needed over said Run would be too expensive for the inhabitants of said Township to build

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to next term

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Thomas Moore of Greenwood and Jno C. Stewart

viewers

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any of them, view the same, and any of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.


