
Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the day of Dec., A. D. 1897, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper

they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a public highway or road in said town ship. leading from a parish on the line between Brown & Berwick area extending to a parish on the Plum road near Garrison School House

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make Report to next year whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Carry Rese & R. Coopers Geo Miller who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


After having given due

of said road of the time and
place of Meeting to view and lay out
the same we met at the Knot Run
School house on Wednesday the Twenty
sixth day of January A.D. One Thousand
Eight hundred and Ninety Eight
and after having been duly Affirmed
in pursuance of the Within order
we proceeded to view and lay out and
do return for public use the following
road to wit.

Beginning at a point
in the public road leading from
Kylesboro to the Knot place and
on line of lands of Mrs. Brown
and Mrs. Bergren. Thence South
(over)

Four degrees west one thousand -
six hundred and thirteen feet
Thence South fifty seven and one half
degrees East. Nine hundred and
Eighty five feet. Thence South Thirty
Eight degrees East six hundred and
sixteen feet. Thence South fifty five
degrees East. two hundred and forty
six feet. Thence South four degrees
West. One thousand three hundred
and twenty seven feet. Thence South
sixty nine degrees West five hundred
feet. Thence South sixty one degrees
West. two hundred and Ninety five feet
Thence South Seventy four degrees
West five hundred and fifty seven
feet. Thence South Eighty Nine degrees
West one thousand four hundred
and forty eight feet to a point in public
roadd at Lancing School house which is
the point of ending of said road as viewed
and laid out by us. Which said road so as
aforesaid viewed and laid out by us we are
of opinion is necessary for a public road.
