

The undersigned citizens of the County of Clearfield would respectfully remonstrate against the vacation of the road laid out from Wilson Hoover's lower fording to Wilson Hoover's upper fording and as to which a petition for the vacation thereof was filed to the above number and term.

The remonstrants represent that the said road is a source of but little outlay to the district and is a matter of much public convenience that travel between the points stated would be obliged to follow a long roundabout course if this road was vacated.

That the damaged condition of the road is due not so much to the action of the flood as to the sliding of timber and logs down the hill and across the said road, thereby damaging the road bed.

They therefore pray that the vacation of said road be refused.

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Lawrence Township respectfully represents

That a public road in said township of Lawrence Beginning at a post at Wilson's Hoover's lower fording on the North West side of Clearfield Creek by marked trees Thence up the said creek through land of John W Tate William Graham Robert Wrigley and John R Parks South 45 deg West 9 per to a stone Thence South 51 deg West 70 per south 48 deg West 23 per South 40 deg West 20 per South 240 deg west 26 per south 4 deg west 10 per to an ash thence south 19 1/2 deg East 16 per to a post thence South 26 1/2 deg East 20 per to a post in the Township road at Wilson Hoover's upper fording by the old bridge on land of Jno R Parks .- was confirmed by said Court the 29th of September 1882 and duly laid out by said Township Supervisor in 1883 .- That by reason of high water a great portion of said road has been washed away and the same has become useless and burdensome for the Township to keep in repair .- That said road has not been traveled for a number of years .- They therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint viewers to view and vacate the same and they will ever pray & c.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23 day of Dec, A. D. 1897, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Locumence,

, in said county, setting forth that a public Road in said Township of Locumence. Beginning at a post at Wilson Hoover's house bordering on the North West side of Clearfield Creek by marked trees. Thence up the said Creek through lands of Wm. Tal-Wm. W. Wadams, Robert Craigby of John R. Parks \$105⁰ at 9 per to a stone. thence \$151⁰ W. 70 per. S. 48⁰ W. 23 per. S. 40⁰ W. 20 per. S. 240⁰ W. 26 per. S. 4⁰ E. 10 per. to a post in the Township road at Wilson Hoover's property by the old Bridge on lands of Geo. R. Parks.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Mark Report to next Session whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint J. Oglesby, A. D. Macagton, M. McDonald who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

having been present together with Zachariah
Ogden and Alexander Livingston. all persons
appointed as aforesaid at the view of said road
and after being duly sworn or affirmed in
pursuance of said order, we have viewed the
said road, and that we find the road utterly
unfit for travel. It having originally been built
along the side of a very steep hill, and shortly
after having been built extensive land slides
occurred and the road has never as a wagon
road been used since. this occurred in 1884. the road
having been built in 1883. in view of these facts
we are of the opinion that the same has
become useless, inconvenient and burdensome
and ought therefore to be vacated

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
