Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 5 day of Sept, A. D. 1898, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Duich

in said county, setting forth that they have a piece of a public road in said Duich running from the east line of the Borg of Rainey east to an intersection with the road leading from the Beulah public road to Hopdale which your petitioners believe has become useless & inconvenient & burdensome

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{vacate} lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Charles Maxwell H. E. Culerson & J. L. Robeson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds ~~proposed~~ of ~~the~~ said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for ^{vacation} such road, they shall proceed to ^{vacate} lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We, the undersigned, persons appointed by the within order
of court, to view the road therein mentioned, respectfully report:

That having given due public notice of the time and place
of the meeting of the said viewers for the purpose of their appoint-
ment, according to law and the Rules of Court, said viewers met at
the time and place in said notices mentioned, to wit, the 15th day
of November, A.D., 1898, and the said viewers having each been ^{joint} several-
ly sworn according to law, in pursuance of said order, and all being
present at said view, we have viewed the said road, and we are of
the opinion that the same has become useless, inconvenient, and bur-
densome, and ought therefore to be vacated. We therefore report in
favor of the vacation of the within described road, to wit, begin-
ning where said road crosses the eastern line of the Borough of
Ramey thence north $31^{\circ}15'$ east 549 and $4/10$ feet, thence north 5°
 $9/100$ minutes east 756 and $2/10$ feet to the intersection of this
road with the public road leading from the Beulah Public road to
Houtzdale. A draft of the road as vacated is hereto attached and
made a part of this report.
