Public Bridges  
Versus

Burnside Paper.

Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the 28 day of February, A. D.

1898, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside in said

County, setting forth that they have been laboring under great inconvenience for a public bridge across the river (on the road from Patchinville to Glen Campbell) and that the erection of said bridge will cost more than it is reasonable said Townships should bear. The road has been a public highway for about 35 years & never had a bridge to cross except a temporary one the citizens paid for by permission of Mr. Patchinville's mill dam. It is now unsafe. In highwater the citizens on the west side have to travel about 5 miles to get across.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, to locate a bridge at said point,

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. F. McCloskey, W. B. Reed, and Jacob Burger

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any one of them, view the same, and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly; at May Term 1898.

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.



We, The undersigned, viewers appointed  
by the within Order of Court, to view the  
Site for a Public Bridge across the River  
on the Road leading from Patchinville to  
Glenn Campbell, Respectfully report. That  
having given notice of the time, and place of meet-  
ing, according to the act of assembly: and be-  
ing all present at the view of the site proposed  
for the said Bridge: and being all sworn, or  
Affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order of  
Court; we have attended to the duties of our ap-  
pointment. and find that in our opinion, a Bridge  
at that point, is necessary; and greatly needed,  
for Public use. and we are also of the opinion,  
that that the Cost of erecting said Bridge, would  
be too great for the Township of Burnside to  
bear. And we recommend that the County, build  
the said Bridge: or at least assist the Township  
in building it. The said Bridge will require a  
single span, one hundred and fifty four feet  
(154) in length, and Fifteen (16) feet high, above  
low water mark. We recommend the Township  
build the abutments, and the County build, or  
bear the Cost of building the Bridge
