To the Honorable Judge of said Court,

We the undersigned citizens of Boggs Township, respectfully remonstrate against the confirmation of a public road laid out in  
said Township, beginning at a point on the Spring Valley road at  
Long Run Bridge and ending at or near the Thos. Beers Estate, for  
the following reasons:

1st, There are already sufficient roads between the two points  
called for in the petition to accomodate the travelling public.

2d, Because the road as marked for in the petition will only  
accomodate one family.

3d, Because the said road would be expensive to build and is not  
necessary to accomodate the travelling public.

4th, Because the citizens of Boggs Township are not asking for  
said road.

5th, Because if said road is necessary between the points called  
for, it can be constructed on a shorter route and with less  
expense to the Township than called for in the petition in this case.



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of Sept., A. D. 1900, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs

in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience from want of a public road. Beginning at a point on the road leading from Lower Woodland to Spring Valley Church at or near where the said road crosses Long Run and ending at a point on the road leading from Litzs Bridge to the Old Turnpike "at or near the division line of land of the estate of Thomas Beers, deceased and the land of David Adams.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, Harry Hummelbaugh & John Porter who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



To The Honorable Cyrus Gordon president Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Pennsylvania, We the undersigned viewers appointed by the within order of court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said road view and not agreeable thereto and having been severally sworn or affirmed we viewed the ground for the proposed road and have laid out and do return for public use the following road to wit: Beginning at a point on the Road leading from Lower Woodland to Spring Valley church near where the said road crosses Long Run, being at end of road now traveled to J T Pickles, thence through wooded land of Zenas Turner North seventy nine and one half degrees West, twenty-five and seven tenth perches to a post thence through land of same, South seventy-three and one fourth degrees West thirty-four and one tenth perches to a White Oak thence through land of same South eighty-four and one fourth degrees West thirty-four perches to a post thence through land of the same South sixty-eight and one fourth degrees West eleven and three tenth perches to post at improved land of Jno T. Pickles thence on the line between said Zenas Turner and John T. Pickles South ten minutes West sixty-one and five tenth perches to a post thence through cultivated land of said Jno T. Pickles South fifty-nine and one half degrees West thirty-six and four tenth perches to a post thence through same for thirty-nine and three tenth perches, and through wooded land of Mr Wilsoncroft the total distance of fifty and nine tenth perches to a post thence by the same South eighteen degrees, five minutes East nine and seven-tenth perches to a post thence through same, South thirty degrees ten minutes East fifteen and two tenth perches to a post on line of J T Pickles thence by said line between J. T.
