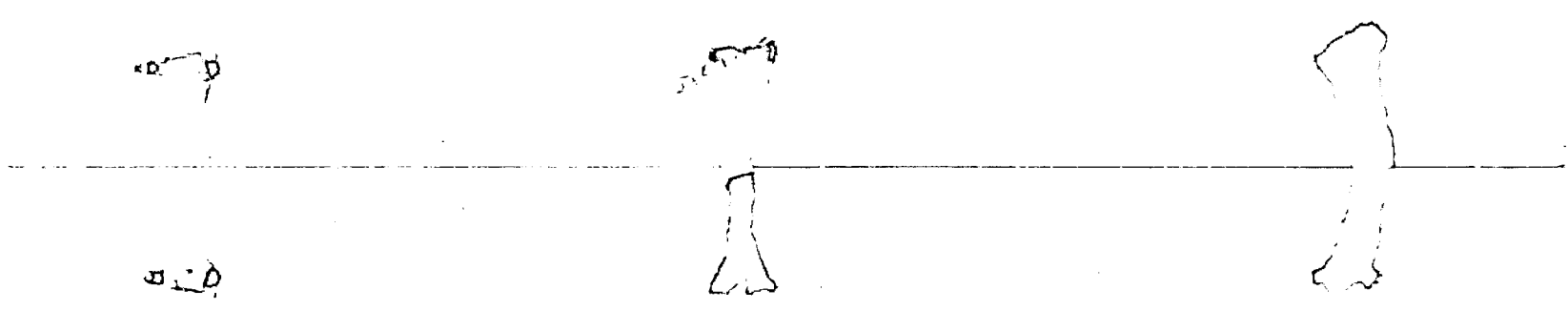
The undersigned citizens of Sandy Township, respectfull repre-

view and lay out said new road, and to vacate said road now open,
and make report of their proceedings to the next Court.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of Clearfield,County.

We the undersigned,appointed by the annexed order,do report.That in pursuance thereof after having been severally sworn,all the viewers appointed by said order viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road,and we the undersigned(a majority of said viewers) do agree that there is occassion for a road,as described by the petitioners,and that the same is neccessary for a public road.And having respect for the shortest distance and the best ground for ~~for~~ such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property,and as far as ~~possible~~ practiable,agreeable to the desire of the petitioners and do so return for public use the following described road,to wit; Beginning at a point in Public Road at DuBois Clear Run Camp in Sandy Township Clearfield Co.Pa.Thence South Fifty Five Degrees and Forty Minutes West (S 55 40 W) Fourteen Hundred Feet.Thence South Fifty Five Degrees and Ten Minutes West (S 55 10 W) Eleven Hundred Feet.To a point in the Public Road at Hetricks School House,Sandy Township Clearfield Co.Pa. being a total distance of Twenty Five Hundred Feet from place of beginning.and shown on draft attached hereto as SUPPLY.We further report that before the said view Public Notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers was given by adfertisements put up at the beginning and terminus of view Ten days before said meeting.We further report that we reviewed the road beginning at a point in the public road near the Hetrick School House and terminating at a point in the public road at DuBois Clear Run Camp,shown on draft hereto attached as VACATED,and de reccomend the vacation of same.

No claim was made for damages.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 4 day of December, A. D. 1897, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy, in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from what is known as DuBois Clear Run Camp, starting from the public road at the point, to a point in front of the Hetrick School House, on the public road leading from the Clear Run Church to Harvey's Run, (all in Sandy Township) They also respectfully represent that in case said road is laid out as aforesaid, that a public road now open, leading from said DuBois' Camp to Henry Hetricks, will become useless and burdensome,

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, *and report to next term of Court* whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo. B. Campbell *vs.* Geo. Grant, and Geo. W. Pifer who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

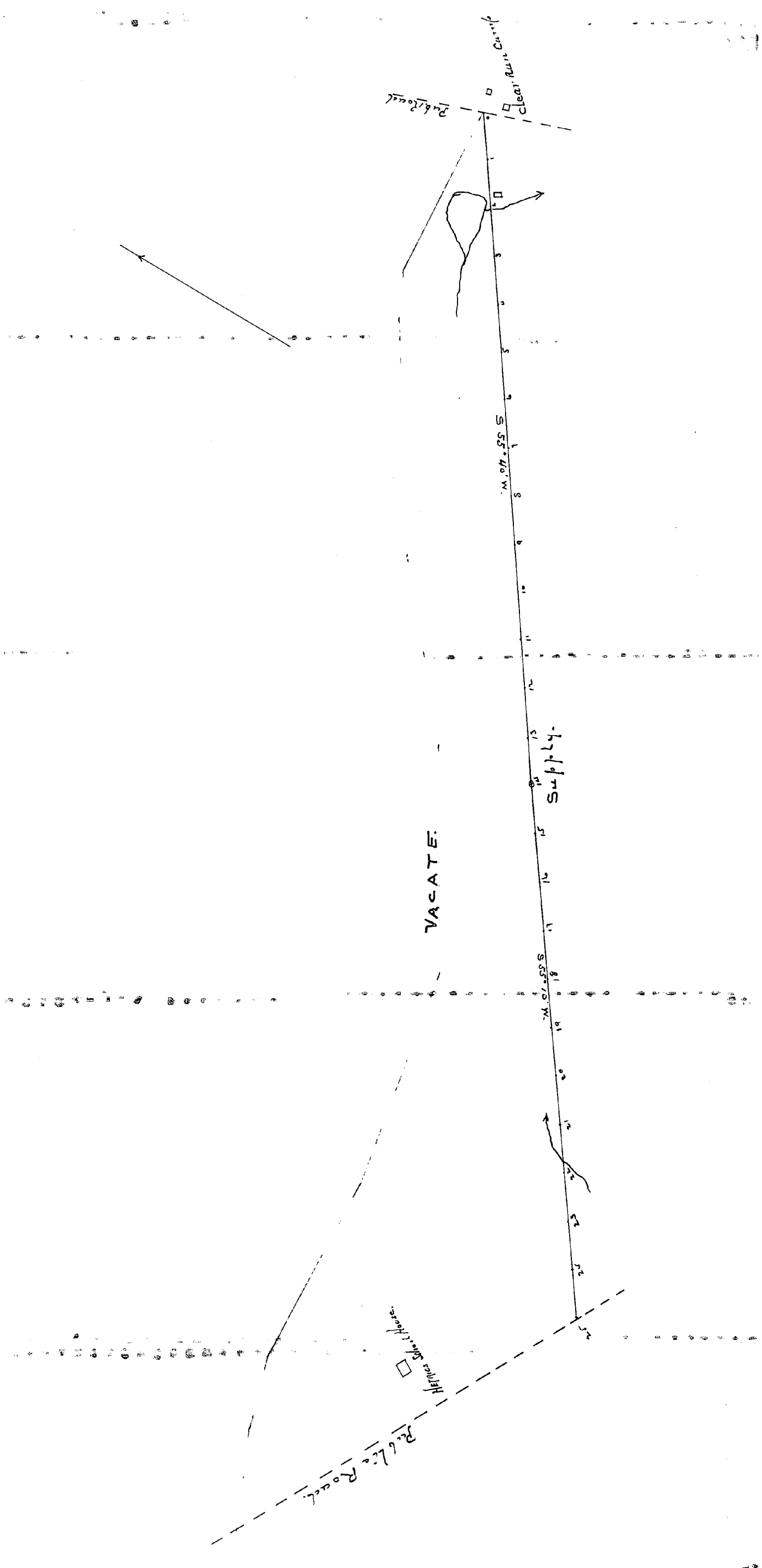

 Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
