

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of September, A. D. 1800, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Union

, in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a Public Road to begin at a point on the Public road leading from Home Camp to the Sabula Road at "Boar Jack" near Wm H. Browns barn at West end of a place on said road known as "The Fill" and to end at a point on Sabula road known as "Boar Jack" following division line between lands of J. A. Tansise and Jas. Cunningham in said Township of Union to the Sabula Road. Hence to point known as "The Boar Jack" the petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint three disinterested persons qualified according to law to view the ground proposed for such road and if they see occasion to lay out the same and to engage an advocate the public road now opened from that point known as "The Fill" near Wm H. Browns barn aforesaid on line of and point of beginning of the proposed road to the point on the Sabula Road known as "The Boar Jack" in said Township of Union which said last mentioned road will by reason of the laying out of the proposed road become useless, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo. C. Kirk, Charles Shoemaker and Earl Bumbaker who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their <sup>and facette and supply</sup> appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ <sup>locate and supply</sup> the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

## ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

The following persons, having refused to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and the opening of the said road in the annexed return described, we, the undersigned viewers, under oath in pursuance of our duty, under the Act of Assembly, do assess their damages and make report thereof, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Judge within named: We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order do report. That in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn according to law. All the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such, we have laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road to wit:- Beginning at a point on Sabula road and known as the "Boot Jack" thence  $5.18\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. in road now laid out on lands of John Vancise, 528 ft. thence still on lands of said Vancise,  $S.23\frac{3}{4}^{\circ} W.$ , 410 ft. to a point in the line between lands of said Vancise and James Cunningham. thence  $N.89\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$ , on the line between lands of said Vancise, James Cunningham and Joseph Eg Rock and partly on lands of Wm. H. Brown, 1984 ft. to a point in the public road leading from the "Boot Jack" to Honey Camp.

We further report that there are no damages accruing to any of the owners of the land over which said road passes, by reason of the opening of the same, except as to Wm. H. Brown. And therefore having taken into Consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages to be derived to the said Wm. H. Brown, from the road passing through his land, we have assessed the damages sustained by the said Wm. H. Brown, at the sum of fifteen dollars, as hereinafter stated.

That we have enquired and do vacate the following described public road to wit:- Beginning at a point in the public road leading to Sabula, (also the beginning point of the first mentioned road), thence  $S.50\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$ , 390 ft. thence  $S.58\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} E.$ , 213 ft. thence  $S.39\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} E.$ , 278 ft. - thence  $S.49\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$ , 444 ft. - thence  $S.73\frac{1}{4}^{\circ} E.$ , 377 ft. - thence  $S.83\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$ , 414 ft. thence  $S.49\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$ , 181 ft. to a point where the above described road ends.

That before the said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity, that notice was given the County Commissioners by mailing a notice to them, that personal notice was given to the supervisors of Union township, as well as on all the owners of the land over which said road passes, and the road to be vacated - ten days before said view. And we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes, and also a description and draft of the road vacated.

 Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.  
 N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
