At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 8th day of May, A. D. 1810, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Gulich, in said county, setting forth that a certain road leading from Janesville in said township along the course of Little Muddy Run to Bigler Township line, said road has not been in use for several years, and what has formerly been a part, parcel and terminus of said road in Bigler Township has been vacated and the remainder of said road is no use to the traveling public.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Thomas Blythe, Joseph G Higgins and John Dunn who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

To THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES WITHIN NAMED.

WE, the undersigned, persons appointed by the within order of court, to view the road therein mentioned, respectfully report: That having been present at the view of the said road, and having all been first severally sworn or affirmed, in pursuance of said order, we have viewed the said road and find that it has been practically abandoned for years, and that the Bigler Township portion has been abandoned and we believe vacated, and that we are of the opinion that the same has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, and ought therefore to be vacated. We, the viewers do agree to vacate the said road as desired by the petitioners. 
