The undersigned citizens of Girard township respectfully represent .- That in 1857 a public road was laid out leading from Wolf run in Lawrence township to Karthaus in what is now Karthaus township .- That portions of said road have been opened up but that the portion of said road located in Girard township leading from Myler Murray's to the farm of Alexander Muray's was never opened .- That the above mentioned portion of said road is not needed for the reason that there is a public road running parallel with the same between the above mentioned points which affords all the accommodation that the travelling public needs .- That the said road would be very expensive to make and would not be passible in winter on account of the drifts .- That Girard township at the present time is heavily indebt and unable to make new roads .- That this piece of ^{road} being useless by reason of the other road having been made through between the same points should be vacated .- They therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint three viewers to view and vacate the same and make return to the next term of said Court and they will ever pray & c

We the undersigned, Viewers, Appointed
by the within Order of Court, to view, and Vacate
the Road therein mentioned, respectfully report.
That having given notice of the time, and place of
Meeting, according to the Act of Assembly, and being
all present at the View of the said Road, and be-
ing all sworn, or Affirmed, in pursuance of the said
Order We have Viewed, And Vacated the said Road
as follows. to wit. Beginning at a point on said road,
on the line of the farm of Alexander Murray, near
the Graveyard. and run through land belonging to
M. & A. Murray, north fifty Eight and a half west.
one hundred and fifty, feet, to a Post, thence south sixty
Eight degrees west, Three Hundred and fifty five feet.
South Eighty Eight degrees west, one hundred and fifty
four feet. North seventy Eight and a quarter degrees
west, One hundred and fifty Two feet. North fifty seven
degrees west, One hundred and twenty feet, North fifty
six and a half degrees west, One hundred, and Eighty
three feet. North seventy nine and three quarters degrees
west. two hundred and twenty three feet. North Eighty
Three and a quarter degrees, west, Three hundred and
sixty four feet, Thence still through land of M & A
Murray. and land of Peter Beausigneur, and land
of Henry Mastel North seventy and a half degrees
west, four hundred and thirteen feet. Thence through

land of Peter Beausigneur north seventy nine degrees
west, two hundred and forty seven feet, north eighty
nine degrees west, one hundred and forty one feet.
South Eighty Two and Three quarters degrees west, three
hundred and thirty feet. South eighty nine and three

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3rd day of September, A. D. 1900, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Girard

, in said county, setting forth that in 1857 a public road was laid out leading from Wolf Run in Lawrence Township to Karthaus in what is now Karthaus Township. That portions of said road have been opened up but that portion of said road located in Girard Township leading from Kyle Murray ^{to the farm of Alexander Murray} was never opened. That the above mentioned portion of said road is not needed for the reason that there is a public road running parallel with the same between the above mentioned points which affords all the accommodation that the traveling public needs. That the said road would be very expensive to make and would not be passable in winter on account of the drifts.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. J. McClosky, Alex Livingston and Robert Flegal who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view ^{and vacate} the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers ^{view and vacate} agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, ~~and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road,~~ together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, ~~and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained,~~ and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road ~~is intended to pass~~, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
