


To the Hon. George Corson, Judge of the Court
of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Penna.

We, the persons appointed by the said court, to view
and lay out the road in the annexed order men-
tioned, respectfully report, that, after due public
notice, we met at the house of A.P. Fry, in Burnside
Township, said county, on Monday, July 30th, 1908; and
that after having been first severally sworn or affirmed,
all of us having viewed the ground for the proposed
road, and all concurring, did lay out, and now
return the same for a public road, beginning at
a point on the public road leading from Cherrytree
to Burnside. Thence along the line between the land of
V. Tonkin and the land of A.P. Fry, South seventy one degrees
East sixteen hundred feet to a post, thence through land
of James Wilson the following courses and distances,
South seventy six and one half degrees East two hun-
dred and sixty two feet, North eighty two and one
half degrees East six hundred and sixty eight feet
and North seventy five degrees East six hundred
and forty eight feet to post, corner of lands of Thomas
Rager and Vincent Tonkin, thence along line between
lands of said Rager and said Tonkin, South seventy
eight degrees East nine hundred and fifteen feet
to a post, thence South sixty nine and one half
degrees East, along line between land of V. Tonkin and
land of John R. Young, twenty four hundred and
eighty five feet to a point on the Public Road
leading from Patonville to Westover and to Five
Points, with reference to the improvements through

which it passes, a plot or draft whereof is hereto annexed.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21st

day of May, A. D. 1800, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Burnside

in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road in said township to begin at a point on public road leading from the Cherry Run & Burnside at or near the junction of Dry Run extending and connecting with a public road leading from Potatinkin & Newins to other points about near the house of John Young.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *M. J. Negele, J. F. Day, & Henry Wilson* who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court. RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewer, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road they will report to that effect.
