At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March, A. D. 1900, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike

....., in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway in the Township of Pike in said county, to begin at a point on the road leading from Robin's School House to Blooms bridge, at the proposed location of the Bridge across the Susquehanna River from Connewille Boro. to Pike Twp. as recommended by the viewers and Grand Jury and approved by the Court to No 4 Febry. sess. 1900 said point being on lands of Jas. R. Norris and extending thence to a point on road leading from Connewille to Bloomington on lands of Jno. S. Bloom, at or near the watering trough on said road to Bloomington, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, R. M. Johnson and A. C. Dale who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
