To The Honorable Cyrus London President Judge of the Court of Quarter sessions of Clearfield County Pa. we, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the within order of court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of the said course and met in accordance with the said notice and having been severally sworn of affirmed we viewed the ground for the proposed road and have viewed and laid out and do return for public use the following road to wit: Beginning at a post at Susquehanna River at the proposed location of bridge across the same to Curwensville Borough thence through improved land of Jas Morris South eleven and one fourth degrees East nine hundred and eighty-six feet to post thence South twenty-three and one half degrees West two hundred and forty-one feet to post thence South forty-four degrees forty minutes West one hundred and fifty-three feet to post thence South fifty-nine and three fourth degrees West one hundred and sixty-two feet to a post thence South fifty-seven degrees ten minutes West one hundred and eighty feet to a post fence still by improved land of said Jas Morris and Jefferson Bloom South fifty-and one half degrees West one hundred and thirteen feet to a post thence through improved land of Jefferson Bloom aforesaid South thirty-six degrees West one hundred and seven feet to a post thence by the same South twenty-three and one half degrees West two hundred and eighty feet to post at or near line of Jas Morris aforesaid thence by wooded land of Jas Morris aforesaid and improved land of Jefferson Bloom aforesaid and Blake Bloom South ten degrees and fifty-minutes West five hundred and thirty feet to a post thence through wooded land of Blake Bloom aforesaid South twelve degrees twenty-five minutes West one hundred and seventy-two feet to a post thence by the same South ~~thirteen~~^{thirteen} degrees forty-five minutes West one hundred thirty-three and ~~five~~^{nine} feet to a post thence by sand and land of Jas Morris aforesaid South thirty-two degrees West one hundred and sixteen feet to a post thence by land of Jas Morris and John D. Bloom aforesaid, as follows:—South twenty-one degrees forty-five minutes West one hundred thirty-three and five tenth feet to a post thence South fourteen degrees thirty-five minutes West, one hundred and twenty-three and five tenth feet to a post, thence South six degrees and thirty minutes West one hundred and ninety-five feet to a post thence South eighteen degrees and forty minutes West one hundred and seventeen feet to a post thence South eleven degrees twenty minutes West one hundred and ten feet to a post thence South one degree and thirty minutes West one hundred and twenty-three and five tenth feet to a post thence South seven degrees East ninety-eight feet to a post thence South eleven degrees East one hundred and twenty-five and five tenth feet to a post thence South eleven degrees and thirty-five minutes West seventy feet to a post thence South twenty-three degrees forty minutes West one hundred and six feet to a post thence South thirteen and one half degrees West one hundred and five feet to a post, thence South four and one half degrees West one hundred and thirty-three feet to a post thence South seven degrees and twenty minutes West ninety-two feet to a post thence South two degrees and forty-five minutes West one hundred and forty-nine and five tenth feet to a post thence South thirty-two degrees East seventy-seven and five tenth feet to a post thence by same and cultivated land of said Jas Morris South fifty-five degrees ten minutes East one hundred and eighty-eight feet to a post in field thence through cultivated fields of the same South thirty-five degrees forty-two minutes East ten hundred and eighty-six feet to point in Township road near Lewis I. Bloom's farm thence by the said road North four and one fourth degrees East eight-hundred and twenty-three feet to point at Watering trough on road leading from Curwensville to Bloomington, a plot or draft with corners distances and improvements is herein annexed as also assessment of damage, release and notices. At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 2nd day of March, A. D. 1800, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike

, in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway in the Township of Pike in said county, to begin at a point on the road leading from Robin's School House to Blooms bridge at the proposed location of the Bridge across the Susquehanna River from Curwenville Boro. to Pike Twp. as recommended by the viewers of the Grand Jury and approved by the Court to No 4 Feby. 1900 said point being on lands of Jas. R. Morris and extending thence to a point on road leading from Curwenville to Bloomington on lands of Jas. S. Bloom, at or near the Watering trough on said road to Bloomington, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, R. M. Johnson and A. C. Dale who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
