At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28th

day of May, A. D. 1890, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Jordan, in said county, setting forth that

That by proceedings in said Court in No. 9 Sept. sess. 1896 to vacate and supply a road laid out by said Court commencing at a point near the Johnson School House on a public road leading from Duquesville to Allen Hope, thence extending to a point on public road leading from Berwindale to Ironville, a Road was laid out and confirmed absolutely on the 8th day of May, 1897 which vacated a portion of said road and supplied the same by a new road. That a part of the said road supplied has been opened by the supervisors and a part has not yet been opened to wit the part marked on the draft as being 59 perches in length and South 5° East in direction being the section West of the point marked point of vacation on the draft attached to the proceedings in said case - not as yet been opened. But the old road indicated by the green dotted line on said draft and located partly on the line between Hunter & Johnson is opened and used up to that place. That the old road is a good road and has been traveled for about five years in good state of repair and but very little longer in distance than the road made to supply it. That \$50.00 damages was awarded to Mary J. Johnson for damages in the construction of that section of the road. The payments of which would be obligated by leaving the road as is now at said point as well as the cost of opening the road as laid out and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out

the same according to law, and report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McGreevy, George F. Black and James McKeehan who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said ^{vacation} road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ^{vacate} lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
