At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county on the

22 day of May, A. D.

1900, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Beccaria and Glen Hope, in said County, setting forth that about the year 1846.

a wooden bridge was built by Clearfield County as a County bridge where the highway crosses Clearfield Creek at Glen Hope and that said bridge has remained a County Bridge ever since that time.

That said Bridge is now in an unsafe condition for public travel and cannot be repaired and that there is danger of said Bridge breaking down and causing heavy damages to said County. Your petitioners further sheet that a County Bridge is much needed at said place, to take the place of the old County bridge and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

and report to next term of Court

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John L. Lightner, Geo. W. Dickey, and D. R. Good

who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially and to the best of their judgment, are to view the place proposed for the said bridge, and if they or any of them, view the same, and any of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such a bridge, and that the erecting of the said bridge would require more expense than it would be reasonable the said townships should bear, they are to make report accordingly;

and a map or plot thereof to be made, which shall accompany said report; the report aforesaid to be made to the next term of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county of Clearfield.
