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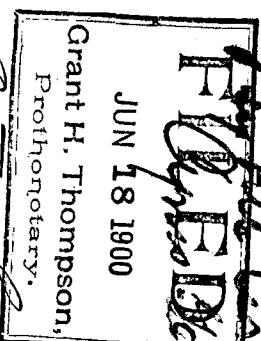

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES WITHIN NAMED.

We, the undersigned, persons appointed by the within order of court, to view the road therein mentioned, respectfully report: That having been present at the view of the said road, and having all been first severally sworn or affirmed, in pursuance of the said order, we have viewed the said road and do agree to vacate and supply that portion of the public road as desired by the petitioners and do vacate and supply the following portions of the public road respectively, Viz: Beginning at a point on road S 64.30 E 136 ft. from Fishers old store building, thence N 64 degrees 30 minutes W 136 ft. to point opposite Fishers old store building, thence North 46 degrees West 150 ft. to point on road, thence North 65 degrees West 188 ft. to point on road, thence North 78 degrees forty five minutes West 200 ft. to point on road, thence North 82 degrees 30 minutes West 341 ft. to point on road opposite lane at A. Anderson's place and terminus of vacated portion of said road.

To supply: Beginning at a point on road South 64 degrees 30 minutes East 136 ft. from Fishers old store building, thence North 80 degrees 30 minutes West 115 ft. to point, thence North 80 degrees West 300 ft. to point, thence North 79 degrees 30 minutes West 381 ft. to point, thence North 58 degrees 30 minutes West 150 ft. to point, thence North 43 degrees 30 minutes West 176 ft. to point opposite lane on said road and terminus of

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

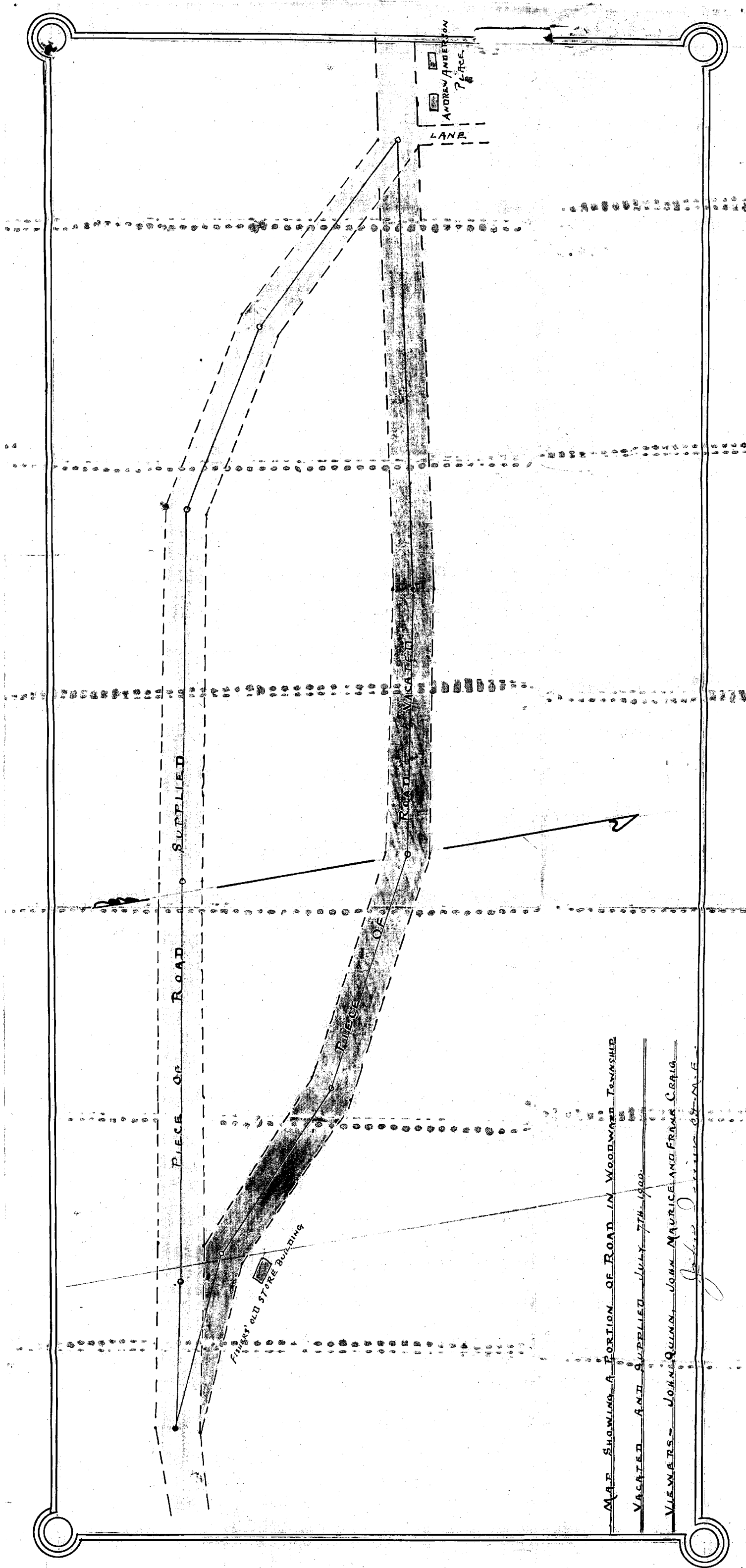

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 18 day of June, A. D. 1900, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Woodward

, in said county, setting forth that That portion of the Public Township Road leading from Old Ocean Mines to Thomas Hendersons. beginning at a point at Fishers old Store Building and ending at the intersection of the lane leading to Bernholders Barn. has become useless & burdensome for the Tax payers of said Township. that the same has become dangerous by reason of the Coal having been mined from underneath the same. that portions of said road has already fallen in. That a New Road to supply said road can be laid out at little or no cost to the Township on a safe location and of easy access on a good ground to supply the aforesaid roads and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and Report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint John Quinn, John Maurice and Frank Craig who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said ^{location} road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ^{vacate} lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, ~~having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distances, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law.~~ Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
