

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 19th day of June, A. D. 1810, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy

, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road, to begin in a public road leading from Rockton to Dubois, at a point near a dwelling of Andrew E. Bogle, in the Township of Sandy, and near the Brady and Sandy Twp line, and thence through lands of Andrew E. Bogle and Thomas Keen to end at a point on the public road leading from Andrew Liddles to the Brick School House near the dwelling of Thomas Keen in said Township of Sandy.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint George B. Campbell, Alexander Shea and Henry Petty who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of Clearfield County.Pa.

We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order, do report. That in pursuance thereof after having been severally duly sworn or affirmed, all the viewers appointed by said order viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and we the undersigned, (a majority of said viewers,) do agree that there is occasion for a road, as described by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect for the shortest distance and the best ground for such road we have laid out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and do here return for public use the following described road, to wit; beginning at a point in a public road leading from DuBois, to Rocton, near the dwelling of Andrew E.Bogle, in the Township of Sandy. Thence through lands of said Andrew E.Bogle, North Two degrees and fifteen minutes west. (N 2.15 W) Four hundred feet. (400) thence through same North Four degrees and ~~forty~~ ~~thirty~~ minutes twenty minutes east (4.20 E) Three hundred feet. (300) thence through same One degree and thirty five minutes west (N 1.35 W) One hundred feet, (100) thence through same North Eleven degrees and forty five minutes west (N II.45 W) One hundred and sevent two feet. (172) thence through same North Eightee degrees and fifty five minutes east (N I8.55 E) Six hundred and fifty three feet. (653) to lands of John E.DuBois. thence through lands of John E.DuBois. North Eighteen degrees and forty minutes east (N I8.40 E) Ten hundred and seventy five feet (1075) to lands of Thomas Keen. thence through lands of Thomas Keen North Three degrees east (N 3-E) Two hundred feet (200) thence through lands of same North Seventeen degrees West (N I7- W) Four hundred and ninety feet (490) thence through same North Sixty One degrees and Thirty minutes west (N 61.30 W) Three hundred and Ten feet to a point in Public Road leading from Andrew Liddles to brick School House. Near dwelling of Thomas Keen, in said Township of Sandy. Being a total distance of Thirty Seven Hundred feet. (3700)

No claim for damages was made. We further report that before the said view public notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at the beginning and terminus of view, Ten days before said meeting notice was given to Geo Grant Supervisor of Sandy Township.

We annex hereto a plot or draft of Center line of said road as laid out stating the courses and distances.

There is no improvements on this line.

NOTE:—In case of a private road, the road must be in favor of the petitioner for said road. Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

The petition of the undersigned respectfully represents:-

That they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road, to begin in a public road leading from Rockton to Du Bois, at a point near a dwelling of Andrew E. Bogle, in the Township of Sandy, and near the Brady and Sandy Twp's line, and thence through lands of Andrew E. Bogle and Thomas Keen to end at a point on the public road leading from Andrew Liddle's to the Brick School House, ^{ing} near the ~~dwelle-~~ of Thomas Keen, in said Township of Sandy.
