Weaver farm in said Township of Lawrence running through the aforesaid County Home Farm close to the buildings on said farm to Clearfield Creek a short distance above the mouth of said Creek where it empties into the Susquehanna River.

The said road has become useless for public travel that the location of said road and its maintenance works great inconvenience to the Clearfield County Poor District, in that it prevents the enlargement of certain buildings on the County Home Farm, which enlargement is now necessary for the proper housing of the stock and products of said farm and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ~~and Vacate~~

the same according to law, ~~and report to next term~~

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and

appoint Harry Byers, James Savage and W. J. Hoffer who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed ~~view and vacate~~

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, ~~as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.~~

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the final viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by final viewers.


N^o. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
