

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Dec., A. D. 1900, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy

, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience by want of a public road leading from a point on the public road that runs from Henry Settricks to Jackson Long's, where the road turns to the right to go to Long's, to a point on the public road leading from DuBois to Falls Creek, at the Brick School House East of Falls Creek,

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo. B. Campbell, C. H. Wilson and C. E. Bostwick

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and lay out

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

pursuance thereof after having been severally duly sworn or affirmed, all  
the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the ground proposed for the  
within mentioned road, and we the undersigned, do agree that there is  
occassion for a road as described by the petitioners, and that the same is  
neccessary for a public road. And having had respect for the shortest  
distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner  
as shall do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable  
agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the  
following described road, to wit: Beginning at a point in the public road  
that runs from Henry Hetricks to Jaskson Longs, where the road turns to  
the right, to a point in the public road leading from DuBois, to Falls Creek


No claim for damage was made.

We further report, that before the said view, public notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at the beginning and terminus of the view, ten days before said meeting. Notice was given to J. H. Bailey Supervisor of Sandy Township.

We here annex a plot or draft of Centre Line of said road as laid out, stating the courses and distances. There are no improvements on this line.

Also--Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out daily, so as to be paid to the Viewers.

Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the commissioners, except so far as they are concerned in the charge of Viewers.

N. B.--Title which the Viewers hold, the Viewers are not entitled to, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, and they will report to that effect.

No. 2 Order Sessions, 1900

ORDER

To view and lay out a road for public use in the township of East Jay, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania

At the 2d Sessions, 1900, read and confirmed by Mr. S. R. Road to be opened 25 feet wide, except where there is side hill cutting or embankment and bridging, where to be 16 feet wide.
