



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 15 day of May, A. D. 1901, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs and Knox Woodward, in said county, setting forth that

your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway in the Township of Woodward and Boggs, to begin at new Iron Bridge, spanning Big Clearfield Creek, at the Village of Staunce in Boggs, Knox and Woodward Townships Clearfield Co. Penna., and to lead to and intersect the road leading from fording at Staunce to Jeffries at a point one-fourth of a mile more or less from said fording. The road to be supplied beginning in Woodward Township and ending in Boggs Township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. McCreery, D. R. Rowles, and Commodore P. Rowles who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

In pursuance of The attached order of Court, We the undersigned Viewers being all present, and having been sworn according to law. have this 5<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1901. ~~viewed~~ viewed the ground and finding a road badly needed, laid out the same as follows -

Beginning at the abutments of new bridge across Clearfield Creek in Woodward township, (right side of said creek) from the center of roadway of bridge - South  $40^{\circ}$  East ninety feet, to a post. Thence down the Creek North  $51^{\circ}$  East Two hundred feet to line between Woodward and Boggs townships. (East & West line) Thence North  $47^{\circ} 30'$  East One hundred feet to post. Thence North  $32^{\circ}$  East One hundred feet to post near spring run and ten feet from lot of Tizak Cupples. Thence along same, and lot of Bert Kelley North  $20^{\circ}$  East One hundred and forty feet to post marked 6+40-T. ~~being~~ being point of intersection of road to Jaffins as specified. We find the necessity of a road as thus laid out urgent and immediate, as the bridge is practically useless without same. All notices served as per order of Court and act of assembly.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
