Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17th day of Dec., A. D. 1900, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway.

Beginning at a point near Isreal Wilson corner on the Old State road and ending at the Crooked Sewer Bridge on the Old Erie Turnpike in said Township of Boggs.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reese and W. Eberts and Isaac Beish who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

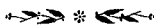

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

put up near the location of said

point of Beginning of said road
in Boggs Township on Thursday
the twenty fourth day of January
A.D. 1901 at ten o'clock A.M. and
after having been duly affirmed in
pursuance of the within order we pro-

return for public use the following
road to wit. Beginning at a point

in the old state road leading to
Wallaceton and at corner of property

south six degrees west Thirteen
hundred and eighty four feet
thence south fifty six feet. Thence
south fifty one degrees west one
hundred and thirty seven feet
to a point in the Erie Turnpike
at Crooked Sewer School house.

Which said road so as afore-
said viewed and laid out by us
we are of opinion is necessary for
a public road.
