



RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

Know all Men by These Presents, That we, the undersigned owners of lands through which the road located by the viewers, under the annexed order, passes for and in consideration of the sum of ONE DOLLAR to us respectively paid by the James Hudson at and before the ensealing and delivery hereof, have remised, released and forever quit-claimed; and do hereby remise, release and forever quit-claim to the said James Hudson all damages that may arise to us respectively by reason of the location and opening of the said road, so that neither we nor any of us, nor any person claiming under us, can or may hereafter ask, sue for, demand, have or receive any damages for injuries arising or growing out of the location and opening of the road aforesaid.

ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23
day of May, A. D. 1900, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in said county, setting forth that

Hudson labors under great inconvenience for want of a road to lead from his dwelling house in Lawrence Township to the Public Road leading from the Borough of Clearfield to the Village of Glen Richey in Lawrence township at a point on said road at or near the house of John Shugart in Lawrence township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and report to next Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, Daniel Connelly, Ed John Smith who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a ~~PUBLIC~~ ~~or~~ PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clear-
field County Pa. we the undersigned viewers
appointed by the within order of Court to
view and say out the road therein men-
tioned respectfully report that we gave
good and lawful notice of the said roadview
and met agreeable thereto on the 26th day
of August A.D. 1901 and on account of sick-
ness of D Connally a viewer we adjourned
the view until the 31st day of Aug 1901 and all
being present and being severally sworn
affirmed we have viewed and said out and
do return for private use the following
road to wit beginning about five between said
of Joe Hudson & James Mitchell at a mark on
farm thence by said line south twenty-five
degrees and forty minutes West seventeen and
three tenth perches to a point eight miles south
of small post in same thence by said same through
land of Robt Mitchell heirs and John Blugarts by
a line which in centre of road is eight feet distant
and parallel with three maple trees along said
line on land of Joe Hudson aforesaid North
eighty-eight degrees and twenty minutes West
thirteen and eight tenth perches to public road
leading from the Borough of Clearfield to Glen Richy.
Said road being laid out sixteen feet in width
and being necessary in our opinion for a private
road. Damages assessed elsewhere in report
and a plat showing courses distances and improve-
ments attached to report. Whereas our hands this 31st

NOTE:—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed, and set the amount out at the foot of their return.

Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

N. S.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
