At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 4<sup>th</sup>

day of January, A. D. 1901, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper

, in said county, setting forth that

your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a Public Road or Highway to lead from "Public Road at Nick Piffer" to Taylor Crossing on public road leading from Pleasant Hill to Beale." your

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Report to next term Feby 1901 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reece Peter Mayer and Harry Jones who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed view and lay out agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

 Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.  
 N. B.--If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

To the Honorable

The Judge of the  
Court of Quarter Sessions of Clear-  
field County Penna. We the under-  
signed persons appointed by the  
within order of Court to view and lay  
out the road therein mentioned  
respectfully report that after having  
given due public notice by three  
written and printed Notices put up  
Near the location of said road of the  
time and place of meeting to view  
and lay out the same and also having  
given due notice to the County  
Commissioners of Clearfield County  
and the supervisors of Cooper town-  
ship of the time and place of said  
meeting we met at Pleasant Hill  
Mines in Cooper Township Clear-  
field County on Friday the eighteenth  
day of January A.D. 1901 and after  
having been duly Affirmed in  
pursuance of said order we proceeded  
to view and lay out and do return  
for public use the following road  
to wit. Beginning at a point in  
the public road leading from

Cooper to Sylvestown and on lands  
of Nicholas Peiffer. Thence running  
South four degrees west twelve hun-  
dred and thirty-four feet. Thence South  
six degrees west four hundred and  
sixty six feet. Thence South ten degrees  
west three hundred and sixty seven feet.  
Thence South eight degrees west four  
hundred and seventy one feet. Thence  
South nine degrees west one hun-  
dred and twenty three feet. Thence South  
one degree west one hundred and  
forty three feet. Thence South three deg-  
rees East three hundred and fifteen  
feet to a point in public road lead-  
ing from Phasant Hill mines to  
Peale at Taylor Crossing. Which said  
road so as aforesaid viewed and laid  
out by us we are of opinion is neces-  
sary for a public road.

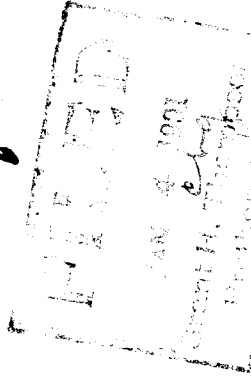
