Clearfield County, ss:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 20 day of February, A. D. 1901, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence

, in said county, setting forth that

a part of a public road in said township in being vacated by proceedings had in your Honorable Court without supplying said road. That your petitioners will labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway in the Township of Lawrence beginning at a point in the public road leading from Clearfield to Woodland at or near the east side of H.C. Graham's lot in said Township and thence running to a public road leading from Clearfield through the County Home Farm to Woodland at or near the mouth of Clearfield Creek it being a part of the aforesaid road running through the County Home Farm to the mouth of Clearfield Creek that it is being vacated as aforesaid and your petitioners desire the laying out of a new road between the points aforesaid to supply the road being vacated and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ^{2d} report to Sept. Court 1901 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Reece, George Hall, ^{2d} Dorsey Linger who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed view and vacate ^{2d} supply agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.



We the undersigned persons
appointed by the within order of
Court to view the road therein
mentioned respectfully report
that after having given due
public notice by three written and
printed notices put up near location
of said road of the time and place
of meeting to view and lay out the
said road and also having given
due notice to the County Commis-
sioners of Clearfield County and
the supervisors of Lawrence
Township of the time and place
of said meeting we met at the
house of A. C. Graham in Law-
rence Township on Thursday
the twenty ninth day of August
A.D. 1901 and after having been
duly affirmed in pursuance of
the within order we proceeded
to view the said road and after
a careful examination of the

place we are of opinion it
is not necessary for a public
road. We find one of your
petitioners Mr. Wm Graham, much
in need of a new road to connect
his premises with the Woodland
and Clearfield road. The road

proper place for his convenience.
but on account of the large
expense in damage and cost of
constriction of said road and
the fact that it would be of little
use to the traveling public we
would report adversely to the
granting of said road

Now Clearfield Pa Sept 16 1904 the petitioner
by his atty, S W Wilson files the following exceptions.

1st Because the views were taken out in a
rig or vehicle provided at the expense of
the owner of the land through which the proposed
road ^{was} to pass.

2nd Because other persons were taken along
by the owner of the land who could not be
in any way interested in the road.

3rd Because the atty (Jas Mitchell) for the
owner of the land appeared at the views
and failed to give atty for petitioner notice
that he would appear so that the road,
and its merits could be properly discussed
by the parties concerned for and con

4th That such a proceeding has no
precedent in the practice of the Bar
to warrant it, as viewers are presumed
to act on their own convictions without
regard to a presentation of the merits of the
road by the parties pro & con & subsequent
written report except to said Report
shall have a final pass on the report

5th Because the views were informed they
could not vacate and supply when the
order, provided for it, and since the
bills of the Report given to all one of the viewers
alleges that he would have made a different
report if he had not understood that the order was
vacate & supply instead of
