

The undersigned citizens of Lawrence Twp. Cleaveland Co. Pa. Respectfully Represent that a public Road was laid out to No 7 September 1899. from a point on public road near the house of Joseph Foster, leaving from Othauta to Blauta. To a point in "public" road leaving from Morgan's Twp. I. Reeds, near the house of Am. Anderson. That said road has been opened in part; That your petitioners now pray your Honorable Court to appoint officers to review and vacate so much of said road as follows viz. 1st that part not opened where the same crosses the property of Joseph Foster and supply the same by a road beginning at a point about 25² perches from the point where the said road enters the public Road leaving to Othauta from Blauta, and thence by new route to strike said public Road near the eastern line of Joseph Foster. 2nd to vacate so much of said road laid out beginning at a point in said road south of the line of Edmon Swarts worth; thence by the nearest and best route to a point in the road leaving from Reeds to Morgan's abo near where the land line between between Swarts worth and Anderson touches said Reeds and Morgan Road, and to make report to your Honorable Court at the next term: All of which is Respectfully submitted.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 4th day of March, A. D. 1901, before the Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence

a public road was laid out to No 7 Sept 21 1899 from a point on public road near the house of Joseph Foster leading from Dshanta to Olanta to a point on public road leading from Morgans to J. A. Reeds near the house of H. M. Andersons. That said road has been open in part. That your petitioners now pray your Honorable Court to appoint viewers to review and vacate so much of said road as follows viz. 1st that part not opened where the same crosses the property of Joseph Foster 2nd supply the same by a road beginning at a point about 25.2 perches from the point where the said road enters the public road leading from Dshanta to Olanta. Hence by new route to strike said public road near the Western line of Joseph Foster, 3rd to vacate so much of said road laid out, beginning at a point on said road south of the line of Edward Swatworth. Hence by nearest of best route to a point in the road leading from Reeds to Morgan's or map where the land line between Swatworth & Anderson doth run and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and vacate and

Supply the same according to law, and Report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, Alex Antes, and Edward Hoover who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to vacate and

Supply agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


