To the Honourable Judge of the Court of
Quarter Sessions in and for
Clearfield County;

We the undersigned Inspectors
appointed by the Court to examine
and report upon the new bridges
lately erected for Clearfield County,
and having been duly sworn or
affirmed, respectfully report
that 1st that the Leonard Bridge
across Clearfield Creek, has been
erected by the Pittsburgh Bridge
Co. in accordance with the contract
and specifications approved by
Samuel Brugger, County Engineer,
2nd that the Litz bridge across
Clearfield Creek has been
constructed by the Berlin
Bridge Co., in accordance with
the contract and specifications
approved by Engineer Brugger,
and we desire to say in reference
to this bridge, that the iron
work is in many instances heavier
than required by the specifications.
3rd that the super-structure of the
Meadow Bridge, across Clearfield
Creek, has been erected in

accordance with the contract and
specifications approved by Mr. Bruggr,
by the Berlin Bridge Co., but
the stone work of this bridge is
in some respects defective.

They also observed that a substantial
side-walk has been added to
this bridge, but it does not
appear to be part of the contract,
as it is not mentioned therein.

Know that the Blaine City bridge,
across Charfield Creek, has
been constructed by the Pittsburg
Bridge Co., in accordance
with the contract and specifications
approved by County Engineer
Bruggr, and we desire to
concerned the appearance of
the masonry of this bridge.

To the Hon. Cyrus Gordon, P.J.,

By virtue of a commission given

on the 6th. day of July A.D. 1903, appointing C.B. Alexander,
A.B. Read, and P.A. Gaulin Inspectors to view the County
bridge recently built and completed over the Susquehanna River
at the end of Susquehanna Avenue in Curwensville Boro. where
the said Avenue would cross the river to a point on the oppo-
site side of said river on the public road leading to
Bloomington, Pa., and report whether said bridge has been
built according to plans and specifications and if said bridge
should be paid for in accordance with the terms of the con-
tract made for the building thereof.

Therefore we the said three inspectors, being duly
sworn, do respectfully make report as follows: That we the
said Inspectors being provided with plans and specification
and contract for the building of this bridge, met at said
bridge on July 22nd., 1903, and proceeded to examine same and
make comparison with plans.

We found said bridge to the best of our knowledge
to measure up to the plans given in the contract for same,
to have the required strength, and to be placed as per con-
tract. All the parts of the structure seemed complete and to
be properly fitted, excepting the absence of six small bolts
which are not of material importance and were cut away to
aid in the better fitting together of the parts of the
bridge.

Your Inspectors would therefore recommend that the
bridge be accepted as per contract.

Your Inspectors would further suggest that the trench
around the abutments, left open by the masons after complet-

ing the stone work, and now full of water, be filled with gravel or dirt, as a better protection to the groundwork of the masonry.

The above is our report made as directed and submitted this 23rd. day of July, 1903.

To the Honorable Cyrus Gordon, President Judge of the said Court:-

The petition of the undersigned supervisors of the Township of Pike, in said County, respectfully represents:-

That a petition was presented in above case and viewers appointed according to law on the 1st day of April 1901, and there report was duly filed recommending a bridge and that the County build both the abutments and the superstructure; but the Grand Jury, in passing upon the same, recommended that the superstructure be built by the County and that Curwensville Borough build one abutment and the township of Pike build the other.

That an inadequate number of witnesses was called before the Grand Jury for the purpose of informing the members thereof as to the necessity for the bridge and the cost of the abutments and other matters pertaining to the same necessary to be known in order to form a proper judgment upon the question.

That Curwensville Borough will not build an abutment and the citizens of the County will thus be deprived of the use of a bridge at this point, where a bridge is very necessary for the use of the public. That the building of the abutments will be a greater burden than Pike Township and Curwensville should reasonable be expected to bear, especially in view of the fact that few if any bridges erected on the River were erected other than by the County and they have all been entered as county bridges.

and that the report made is contrary to law
Your petitioners, believing that an injustice has been done in this matter, respectfully pray the Court to recommit the matter to the Grand Jury at September Sessions, and to make such other order in the

premises as will fully bring the matter before the Court for adjudication and they will ever pray &c




